Special Considerations for Bilingual Education/Dual Language Programs

Students who are being instructed in literacy in their native language with the ultimate goal of biliteracy should be administered reading assessments from the approved menu in both English and the native language, if available. The rationale is to identify at-risk readers, regardless of language of instruction. Students in bilingual or dual-language education programs may appear to be below proficiency in reading on a reading assessment in English. These students should still be referred for summer programming. Ideally, a summer bilingual program would provide the most benefit for students in these regular school year programs. Assessment results should be communicated to parents in a timely manner and should be maintained in the student's cumulative file.
