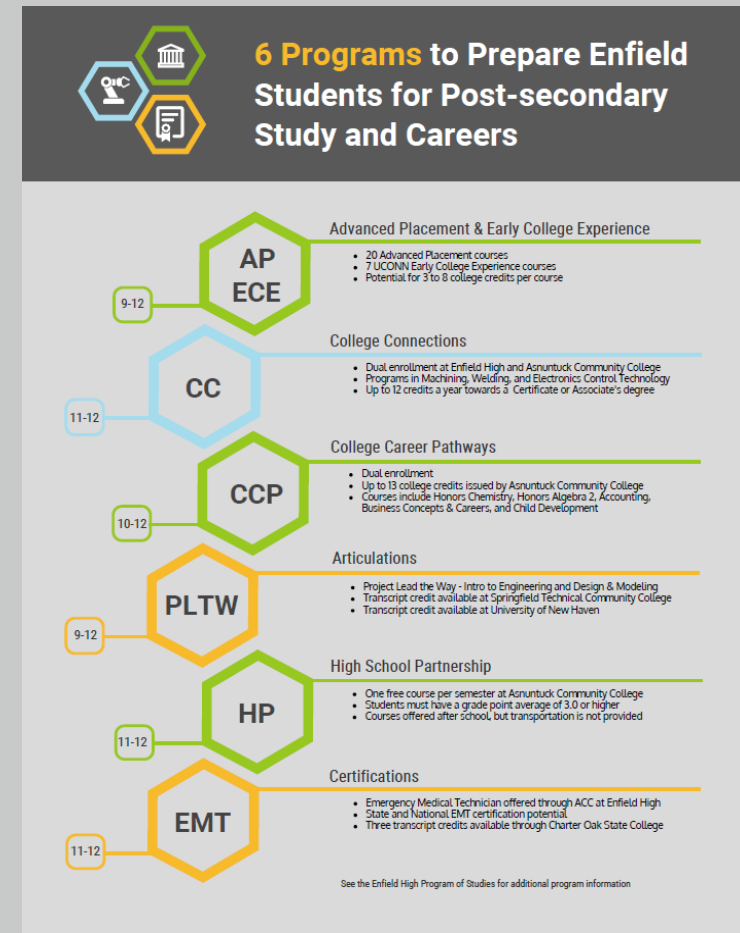

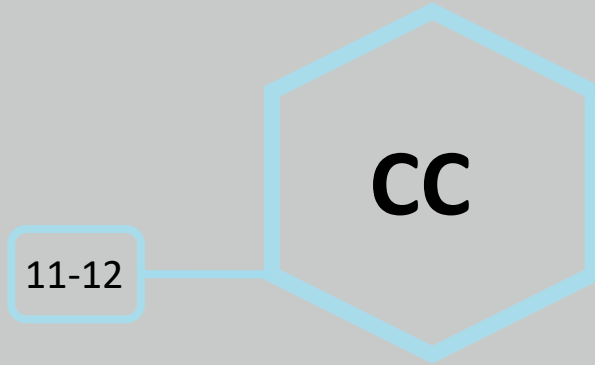

6 Programs to Prepare Enfield Students for Post-secondary Study and Careers

- AP ECE** (9-12)
 - Advanced Placement & Early College Experience
 - 20 Advanced Placement courses
 - 7 UCONN Early College Experience courses
 - Potential for 3 to 6 college credits per course
- CC** (11-12)
 - College Connections
 - Dual enrollment at Enfield High and Asnuntuck Community College
 - Programs in Machining, Welding, and Electronics Control Technology
 - Up to 12 credits a year towards a Certificate or Associate's degree
- CCP** (10-12)
 - College Career Pathways
 - Dual enrollment
 - Up to 13 college credits issued by Asnuntuck Community College
 - Courses include Honors Chemistry, Honors Algebra 2, Accounting, Business Concepts & Careers, and Child Development
- PLTW** (9-12)
 - Articulations
 - Project Lead the Way - Intro to Engineering and Design & Modeling
 - Transcript credit available at Springfield Technical Community College
 - Transcript credit available at University of New Haven
- HP** (11-12)
 - High School Partnership
 - One free course per semester at Asnuntuck Community College
 - Students must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher
 - Courses offered after school, but transportation is not provided
- EMT** (11-12)
 - Certifications
 - Emergency Medical Technician offered through ACC at Enfield High
 - State and National EMT certification potential
 - Three transcript credits available through Charter Oak State College
