- Smarter Balanced alignment to the standards.
- Test accommodations.
- Getting results that can be used to drive improvement.
- Timing of results being reported.
- Variations in technology used to take the test.
- Timing of testing EL students.
- Test preparation based on good instruction vs. drilling.
- Disruption of student learning process by the assessment.
- Wording of test questions.
- Test security.
- Validity and reliability of the assessment.
- What other states are doing regarding consortium testing.
- Length of testing time.
- Moving to computer testing.
- Normative results.
- Information provided on the individual student reports.
- Amount of testing in general both SBAC and other district mandated testing.

VII. Questions for Task Force Consideration

- Defining the purpose of statewide assessment.
- Technological readiness between and among districts.
- Providing normative results.
- Providing more timely results.
- Reducing testing time.
- Meaningfully including colleges and universities in the conversation of improving the climate of testing in public schools.
- Defining college readiness.
