

Information for Grade 1–12 Principals

In order to make this event meaningful, we ask that you consider the following:

- Schedule a virtual planning meeting with teachers, selected PTA members, and representatives from your youth organizations to discuss your school's participation in the Challenge.
- Prepare a letter about the importance of mathematics and distribute copies to all
 of your students and their parents. Let them know your school is participating in the
 Summer Math Challenge, and encourage them to accept the Challenge, too.
- Distribute with your letter, the summer math logs, directions for registering, and other
 materials that are part of your school's efforts to encourage mathematics, and the
 information sheet "Message to Parents and Students." Please make as many copies
 of the information sheet as you need.
- Consider sending a letter to parents and students in early August to encourage students to keep working on their math skills.
- Plan to tally the results when students return in September. Creating an electronic version of the log for students to enter their participation may make final reporting easier. The reporting form is available on the Commissioner's Summer Math Challenge website.
