Description: The Connecticut Department of Agriculture (CT DOAG) provides state reimbursement payments to eligible boards of education for the purchase of locally and regionally sourced food to be used in eligible school meal programs.	Description: The Connecticut Department of Education (CSDE) provides USDA reimbursement payments to eligible school food authorities (SFAs) for the purchase of local and regional unprocessed or minimally processed domestic food products from historically underserved or small business producers and processors, to be used in eligible school meal programs.
<b>Timeline:</b> May 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025 (Restarted annually)	<b>Timeline:</b> November 1, 2022 – April 30, 2025

## Comparison of the State and Federal Local Food for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP)

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Program information may be made available in languages other than English. To file a program discrimination complaint, a Complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at: https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf, from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
