<p>Description: The Connecticut Department of Agriculture (CT DOAG) provides state reimbursement payments to eligible boards of education for the purchase of locally and regionally sourced food to be used in eligible school meal programs.</p>	<p>Description: The Connecticut Department of Education (CSDE) provides USDA reimbursement payments to eligible school food authorities (SFAs) for the purchase of local and regional unprocessed or minimally processed domestic food products from historically underserved or small business producers and processors, to be used in eligible school meal programs.</p>
<p>Timeline: May 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025 (Restarted annually)</p>	<p>Timeline: November 1, 2022 – April 30, 2025</p>
