May 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025 (Restarted annually)

- 50% for CT Grown purchases
- 33% for New England and New York purchases up to the maximum allocation

Federal LFSIP

Description

The Connecticut Department of Education (CSDE) provides USDA reimbursement payments to eligible school food authorities (SFAs) for the purchase of local and regional unprocessed or minimally processed domestic food products from historically underserved or small business producers and processors, to be used in eligible school meal programs.

Timeline

November 1, 2022 - May 30, 2026

Eligibility

SFAs operating the NSLP and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP)

Reimbursement

100% up to the maximum allocation
