


















Beverage Exemptions: Three Criteria

Requirements for Candy Sales

Cannot be sold to students on school premises unless sales meet three requirements

BOE voted to allow food exemptions AND

Sales meet exemption criteria of state HFC statute AND

Event cannot occur while any CNPs are operating

Examples of Candy (includes Sugar Free)

Chocolate
Candy bars
Chocolate-covered nuts and fruits
Hard candies and lollipops
Caramels, taffy, and licorice
