Public school districts that choose to implement the healthy food option of Healthy Food Certification (HFC) under Section 10-215f of the Connecticut General Statutes must follow the Connecticut Nutrition Standards for all foods sold to students separately from reimbursable school meals. For school year 2024-25, 182 of the 189 eligible districts and schools (96.3 percent) are implementing the healthy food option of HFC. HFC-eligible districts are public schools that participate in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National School Lunch Program (NSLP). Public schools include public school districts, the Connecticut Technical Education and Career System (CTECS), charter schools, interdistrict magnet schools, endowed academies, and regional educational service centers.

HFC districts that are new to HFC or have returned to HFC for school year 2024-25 are indicated in **bold**. Schools that participate in the NSLP through an interschool agreement with another public school may choose to implement the healthy food option of HFC if the sponsoring public school implements HFC. These schools are indicated under "Interschool Agreements" on page 4, with the sponsoring district indicated in parentheses.

Changes in Statewide HFC Eligibility and Participation

From school year 2023-24 to 2024-25:

- the number of HFC-eligible districts decreased from 192 districts to 189 districts;
- the number of districts choosing to participate in the healthy food option of HFC decreased from 186 districts to 182 districts; and
- the percentage of HFC participation decreased from 96.9 percent to 96.3 percent.




Figure 1. HFC participation to date

Figure 1 shows HFC participation rates since the first year of HFC implementation (school year 2006-07).
