This document provides an overview of important information and resources for Connecticut claims preparers regarding the entry of accurate claims for reimbursement of meals and milk in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) school nutrition programs operated by the district's school food authority (SFA). The claims preparer is the individual designated by the local educational agency (LEA) to prepare the monthly claims for reimbursement for reimbursable meals and milk in the school nutrition programs. The USDA school nutrition programs include the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), Afterschool Snack Program (ASP), Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the NSLP, Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP), and Special Milk Program (SMP).

All claims preparers must work with their claims submitter to ensure that the monthly claim is submitted timely. The claims preparer must notify the claims submitter that the monthly claim is ready to be submitted (after the claim is prepared) and must check **before** the due date to ensure that the claim has been submitted.

Additionally, the claims preparer must receive e-mails from the Connecticut State Department of Education's (CSDE) e-mail distribution list for Connecticut's school nutrition programs. This e-mail distribution list provides important notifications regarding the federal and state requirements for school nutrition programs. If the claims preparer does not receive these e-mails, please contact the LEA's CSDE school nutrition team member.

Annual Calendar for School Nutrition Programs

The CSDE's *Calendar of School Nutrition Program Requirements and Activities* assists Connecticut schools and institutions that participate in the USDA school nutrition programs with planning for the school year. SFAs should distribute this calendar to each person responsible for completing tasks related to the NSLP, SBP, ASP, and SMP.

Connecticut Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System)

The CNP System is a web-based software solution that provides Connecticut administrators, state users, and sponsors with efficient and immediate access to applications, claims, and related nutrition program functions for the USDA's Child Nutrition Programs. The CNP Online System allows authorized users to submit and approve applications, claims, and miscellaneous forms online, as their security rights permit. It is important that login IDs and passwords are kept confidential and not shared. SFAs must submit claims for reimbursements in a timely manner, according to the CSDE's claims submission schedule. For more information, visit the CSDE's Claim Submission Schedule webpage.

User ID and Password Information
