Direct Certification

During the past few months, the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) has conducted several trainings throughout the state addressing the new procedures for direct certification. Direct certification is the process of determining children eligible for free meal benefits based on documentation obtained directly from the appropriate State or local agency or other authorized individual. For further information, refer to the United States Department of Agriculture's *Eligibility Manual for School Meals*.

As a reminder to all local education agencies (LEAs) participating in the school Child Nutrition Programs (CNPs) and claiming free meals/milk (including the Special Milk Program), the use of direct certification is *not* optional and all LEAs must review this important (and highly confidential) information in order to ensure that eligible children receive access to free meals or milk. Each LEA should have a designated direct certification contact person (only one per LEA) and this is the person who is responsible for retrieving and securing this information. Effective July 2014, working with the Department of Social Services, the CSDE will update this direct certification information weekly during the day on Mondays. Therefore, LEAs should check the information weekly on Tuesdays (at a minimum) to ensure that new students added to the list receive access to free meals/milk benefits. As a reminder, the *Benefit Source Key* uses the following codes to demonstrate how a student is directly certified:

- 1. FS = Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
- 2. AF = Temporary Family Assistance (TFA or TANF).
- 3. OT = Foster, Homeless, Runaway, Head Start, Pre-K Even Start.

Students that are directly certified based on SNAP (FS) or TFA or TANF (AF) are automatically eligible for free meals/milk without further application AND their free eligibility status extends to all children in the household as outlined in the *Eligibility Manual for School Meals*. Students that are directly certified based on either their Foster Child, homeless, runaway, Head Start or Even Start status, are directly certified and automatically eligible for free meals/milk without further application. However, their free eligibility does NOT extend to other children in the household.

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Additionally, LEAs must notify the households in writing when a child is determined to be eligible for free meals/milk based on direct certification. An example of the direct certification notification letter may be found clicking on FORMS on the CNP Web site.

As part of the new direct certification process, the CSDE has established a Direct Certification website. Important information may be found on this Web site including the Direct Certification Web Application Sign In link which is where the direct certification contact person may sign in to gain access to the data. There is also a *New Look of Direct Certification* webinar that is available which provides an overview of the new direct certification process.

Note: Two additional trainings on *The New Look of Direct Certification* will be provided for those LEAs that have not attended this workshop. They will take place at the CSDE in Middletown on **August 13, 2014** and **August 20, 2014**.
