## SUBJECT: Operational Memorandum No. 12-16 Rates of Reimbursement for School Year July 1, 2016 - June 30, 2017

In addition to the rates below, local education agencies (LEAs) that are **certified for compliance** with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) meal patterns will receive an additional six cents reimbursement per lunch.

As a reminder, LEAs must set reduced-price charges for lunch, breakfast and afterschool snacks at or below the maximum reduced price allowed by regulations. These rates cannot exceed 40 cents per lunch, 30 cents per breakfast and 15 cents for afterschool snacks.
