Federal Meal Reimbursement Rates for School Year (SY):

July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

This memorandum summarizes the annual adjustments to the federal reimbursement rates for local educational agencies (LEAs) for lunches, breakfasts, afterschool snacks, and milk served to students participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), Afterschool Snack Program (ASP), and Special Milk Program (SMP); and the NSLP reimbursement rate for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) donated foods for SY 2025-26.

As published in the Federal Register (FR) (90 FR 34827 and 90 FR 39362), the SY 2025-26 federal meal reimbursement rates are listed on page 2 of this memorandum. In addition to these rates, LEAs certified as meeting the meal pattern and nutrition standard requirements set forth in 7 CFR parts 210 and 220 are eligible to receive performance-based cash assistance for each reimbursable lunch served in the amount of **9 cents per lunch** effective July 1, 2025.

As a reminder, LEAs must set reduced-price charges for lunches, breakfasts, and afterschool snacks at or below the maximum reduced-price allowed by regulations. Reduced-price rates cannot exceed 40 cents per lunch, 30 cents per breakfast, and 15 cents for afterschool snacks.

## **National School Lunch Program**

Meal category	Regular rates	Severe need rates *
Paid	\$ .44	\$ .46
Reduced price	\$4.20	\$4.22
Free	\$4.60	\$4.62

\* Severe need rates are available to districts where, in the second prior year, 60 percent or more of the students received lunches free or at a reduced price.

## **School Breakfast Program**

Meal category	Regular rates	Severe need rates *
Paid	\$ .40	\$ .40
Reduced price	\$2.16	\$2.64
Free	\$2.46	\$2.94

<sup>\*</sup> Severe need rates are available to districts where, in the second prior year, 40 percent or more of the students received lunches free or at a reduced price.

#### **Special Milk Program**

Rate: \$ .2675 per half pint. Milk served free of charge to eligible students will be reimbursed at the average cost per half pint of milk.

#### **Afterschool Snack Program**

Paid	\$ .11
Reduced price	\$ .63
Free	\$1.26

## Effective SY 2025-26 NSLP Rate for USDA Foods

Rate: \$.45

The published per meal rate from the Federal Register for SY 2025-26 is 30 cents. The per meal rate (30.5 cents) plus the 12 percent provision dollars and the 20 million breakfast dollars make the effective NSLP rate 45 cents for SY 2025-26.
