Interest Survey for 2021 Summer Meals Programs

In order to plan for implementation of the Summer Meals Programs in 2021, the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) is requesting that all sponsors who participated in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) in summer 2019 or 2020, and any prospective new SFSP organizations, indicate their interest in becoming a SFSP sponsor during the summer of 2021. SFSP sponsors currently active during school year 2020-21 do not need to complete and return the attached Summer Meals Programs Annual Interest Survey Planning Data Form.

All SFSP sponsors and potential sponsors who are not currently active, must complete and return the attached Summer Meals Programs Annual Interest Survey Planning Data Form by May 10, **2021.** Follow the instructions below.

- 1. Complete the "Sponsor name" and "Sponsor contact person" section of the attached Annual Interest Survey Planning Data form and sign, date, and return. Please note that this form must be completed and returned even if there are no changes from 2019 or 2020.
- 2. If your organization participated in the SFSP in 2019 or 2020, review the attached 2019 or 2020 site list and document the necessary changes for summer 2021.
  - Continuing sites: Indicate the planned dates of operation.
  - Discontinuing sites: Place a line through the site information.
  - New sites: Complete the "Proposed New Sites" section of the Summer Meals Programs Annual Interest Survey Planning Data Form and return it with the site listing.
- 3. Submit your response by e-mail to Caroline Cooke at caroline.cooke@ct.gov, by May 10, 2021.

Your response will signify your interest in sponsoring summer meals in 2021. Therefore, it is important that you submit your reply by the deadline. This is not the annual SFSP sponsor application packet. The CSDE will forward additional information regarding the annual application process to the contact person listed under "Sponsor contact person" on the Annual Interest Survey Planning Data form.

## **Summer Meals Programs Annual Interest Survey Planning Data Form**
