# Instructions for Ordering USDA Foods for School Year 2022-23: Orders due March 10, 2022

The Connecticut Food Distribution Program's (FDP) catalog for USDA Foods for school year (SY) 2022-23 opens on **Thursday**, **February 17**, **2022**, in Web Based Supply Chain Management (WBSCM). The deadline to place orders in WBSCM is **March 10**, **2022**. Recipient Agencies (RAs) that miss the ordering deadline will **not** receive USDA Foods.

# Operational Memorandum No. 04-22: Interschool Agreements for School Year 2022-23: Due July 1, 2022 (Full Service) or August 30, 2022 (Vended)

<u>Operational Memorandum No. 04-22: Interschool Agreements for School Year 2022-23</u> is now available on the CSDE's <u>School Nutrition Operational Memos 2022</u> webpage. Sponsors that sell USDA meals or Afterschool Snack Program (ASP) snacks to another district or school during school year 2022-23 must complete and submit an interschool agreement to the CSDE.

- The **Full-service Interschool Agreement form** must be submitted to the CSDE by **July 1**, **2022**.
- The **Recipient Site Vended Interschool Agreements** must be submitted to the CSDE at least two weeks before the start of the school year, but no later than **August 30, 2022**.


# Operational Memorandum No. 05-22: Process for Submitting the HFC Statement for School Year 2022-23: Due July 1, 2022

Section 10-215f of the Connecticut General Statutes requires that each local board of education or governing authority (BOE) for all Connecticut public school districts participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) must **take action annually** to certify whether all food items sold to students will or will not meet the Connecticut Nutrition Standards. This includes all public schools, regional educational service centers, the Connecticut Technical Education and Career System (CTECS), charter schools, interdistrict magnet schools, and endowed academies.

Operational Memorandum No. 05-22: Requirements for Submitting the HFC Statement for School Year 2022-23 is now available on the CSDE's School Nutrition Operational Memos 2022 webpage. This memo provides the required motion language and summarizes the **steps that districts must take now** to ensure the accurate and timely submission of the 2022-23 HFC Statement by the deadline of July 1, 2022.

- All BOEs for public schools participating in the NSLP must vote on the **healthy food option** using the exact language contained in Operational Memorandum No. 05-22.
- BOEs that vote "yes" for the healthy food option must also vote on **food exemptions** using the exact language contained in Operational Memorandum No. 05-22.
- All BOEs may choose to vote on **beverage exemptions** using the exact language contained Operational Memorandum No. 05-22.

The chart below summarizes the required votes.



Districts must schedule the required votes at a meeting of the BOE that occurs **before June 30**, **2022**, to enable submission of the HFC Statement and BOE-approved meeting minutes by **July 1**, **2022**. If the BOE minutes are not finalized by July 1, the district must submit the draft minutes to the CSDE by July 1, then submit the final BOE-approved minutes as soon as they are available.

#### Connecticut Nutrition Standards (CNS) for School Year 2022-23

The CNS for school year 2022-23 will remain the same as the CNS for the current school year. Visit the CSDE's <u>Connecticut Nutrition Standards</u> webpage for the CNS summary, the full CNS document, and a presentation on the CNS.

Public school districts that choose to implement the healthy food option of Healthy Food Certification under C.G.S. Section 10-215f must follow the CNS for all foods sold to students separately from reimbursable school meals on school premises, at all times and from all sources, including a la carte sales in the cafeteria, vending machines, school stores, fundraisers, culinary programs, and any other sources of food sales to students.
