Reminder: First Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Triennial Assessment Due June 30, 2022

The USDA's final rule, <u>Local School Wellness Policy Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010</u>, requires that each local educational agency (LEA) participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. LEAs must complete the first LSWP assessment by June 30, 2022, and make this assessment available to the public. Operational Memorandum No. 09-22: State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant for School Year 2021-22

The CSDE's <u>Operational Memorandum No. 09-22</u> outlines the criteria for payment of the State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant and includes the list of school food authorities (SFAs) with sites that qualify for this grant. USDA Announces Food System Transformation Framework

On June 1, 2022, the USDA announced details of a framework to transform the food system to benefit consumers, producers, and rural communities by providing more options, increasing access, and creating new, more, and better markets for small and mid-size producers. This announcement builds on lessons learned from the COVID-19 pandemic and supply chain disruptions caused by Russia's war in Ukraine. It also provides additional details on the June 2021 announcement to strengthen critical supply chains and address longstanding structural challenges that were revealed and intensified by the pandemic.
