# Final Reminder: First Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Triennial Assessment Due June 30, 2022

The USDA's final rule, <u>Local School Wellness Policy Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010</u>, requires that each local educational agency (LEA) participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. LEAs must complete the first LSWP assessment by June 30, 2022, and make this assessment available to the public. # Final Reminder: School Year 2022-23 Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement due July 1, 2022

As indicated in Operational Memorandum No. 05-22: Requirements for Submitting the Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement for School Year 2022-23, all public school sponsors of the NSLP must complete the annual HFC Statement and upload the board of education's meeting minutes by July 1, 2022, using the CSDE's Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System). The CSDE's Instructions for Submitting Connecticut's Healthy Food Certification Statement for School Year 2022-23 provide important information and specific steps for completing the HFC Statement in the CNP System. # Final Reminder: Full-service Interschool Agreements for School Year 2022-23 due July 1, 2022

Sponsors that sell USDA meals or snacks to another district or school during school year 2022-23 must complete and submit an interschool agreement to the CSDE. Email completed interschool agreements to Sean Fogarty at <a href="mailto:sean.fogarty@ct.gov">sean.fogarty@ct.gov</a>.

- The **Full-service Interschool Agreement form** must be submitted to the CSDE by **July 1**, **2022**. A public school or district (recipient site) that receives meals under contract from a HFC district (providing sponsor) can choose to certify for HFC through this interschool agreement (section 3). For the sponsoring district to receive HFC payments for any recipient sites, the interschool agreement must be submitted to the CSDE by **July 1**, **2022**. If the CSDE receives the interschool agreement after this date, the recipient site's lunch counts will not be included in the total number of reimbursable lunches that are used by the CSDE to determine HFC payments for school year 2022-23.
- The **Recipient Site Vended Interschool Agreements** must be submitted to the CSDE at least two weeks before the start of the school year, but no later than **August 30**, **2022**.

#### **Need to Know**

#### School Meals Assistance Revenue for Transition (SMART) Funds

During the last Connecticut General Assembly, 30 million dollars was allocated to the CSDE for "Free School Meals for Children." Referred to as the School Meals Assistance Revenue for Transition (SMART) funds, SMART funds will allow school food authorities (SFA) that participated in the Seamless Sumer Option (SSO) of the NSLP in school year (SY) 2021-22 to continue to provide meals at no cost to all students for a longer duration of time while allowing for a smoother transition for households to submit free and reduced-price meals applications in SY 2022-23.

The SMART funds will reimburse SFAs the difference between the Federal reimbursement rate for free meals and the reduced-price and paid reimbursement rates. SFAs that receive SMART funds cannot charge students for reimbursable lunch and/or breakfast meals regardless of their individual student eligibility until the SMART funds have been expended.

Sites participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for SY 2022-23, new NSLP sponsors, and SFAs operating the NSLP (not the SSO) in SY 2021-22 are NOT eligible to receive SMART funds.

More detailed information regarding the SMART fund operational requirements and specific allocation amounts will be sent out over the summer along with resources, guidance, and other needed materials. Eligible SFAs will be required to either opt in to or opt out of the SMART funds and must meet the deadlines identified in the materials that will be sent out to SFAs in order to participate.

Please check your emails **weekly** throughout the summer to ensure that you do not miss notifications regarding SMART funds for SY 2022-23.

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# Resource Roundup: Requirements for Financial Management of the School Nutrition Programs

The CSDE's new guide, <u>Requirements for Financial Management of the School Nutrition Programs</u>, contains information and resources to help school food authorities (SFAs) comply with the federal and state regulations for financial management of the USDA's school nutrition programs. This guide is the go-to resource to help SFAs understand the requirements for maintaining a nonprofit school food service account (NSFSA), determine allowable and unallowable expenses, and identify and allocate indirect costs. This guide applies to all public schools, private schools, and residential child care institutions (RCCIs) that participate in the NSLP, SBP, Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the NSLP, ASP, and Special Milk Program (SMP).
