## **Action Items**

### Reminder: Waiver Flexibilities for Summer Meals 2022

On June 30, 2022, the USDA released and the CSDE opted in to nationwide waivers which have immediate impact on summer meals operations (see "New USDA Nationwide Waivers: Child Nutrition Flexibilities and Support for Summer 2022" in the "Need To Know" section below).

The <u>Keep Kids Fed Act</u> extended USDA's authority to issue nationwide waivers for summer programs, including waivers allowing for continued use of the flexibilities in place last summer, such as; waivers for non-congregate meal service, parent/guardian pick-up, and meal service times, that enabled sponsors to implement "grab and go" and other non-congregate meal service models. Since Connecticut opted in to all of these waivers, sponsors approved to operate the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) or the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) need to notify the CSDE's Summer Meals Staff if they intend to implement these waivers. SFSP sponsors should contact their <u>SFSP county consultant</u> and SSO sponsors should notify Caroline Cooke.

Sponsors implementing these waivers must maintain documentation of:

- schools/sites using each waiver;
- start and end date for each waiver used in the program;
- which waivers were implemented at which sites;
- the dates the waivers were implemented;
- supporting documentation (e.g., production records, point-of-service meal counts, menus, edit check worksheets) for all waivers; and,
- how this waiver resulted in improved services to program participants.

Sponsors will be required to report this information to the CSDE at a later date.

## Area Eligibility Waiver Applications Now Being Accepted

The USDA has extended Connecticut's ability to approve summer meals sites to operate in areas that do not meet the previously authorized options to establish area eligibility. Please note that **any sponsors intending to implement the area eligibility flexibility are required to submit an** <u>Area Eligibility application</u> (*Application for Area Eligibility for Emergency Meals Distributions During COVID-19 Public Health Emergency*) to <u>CNPermanentAgreement@ct.gov</u> and must have an approved application **prior to beginning operations**.

# New USDA Nationwide Waivers: Child Nutrition Flexibilities and Support for Summer 2022

On June 30, 2022, the USDA Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) released several new Child Nutrition Program (CNP) nationwide waivers and flexibilities based on authority amended by the KKFA of 2022 to support CNP operations in summer 2022. These waivers and flexibilities increase funding, support access, and balance operational needs with the goal of providing nutritious meals.

- <u>COVID-19: Child Nutrition Response #108</u>: Nationwide Waiver to Allow Area Eligibility for Closed Enrolled Sites for Summer 2022 Operations Extension 4
- <u>COVID-19: Child Nutrition Response #109</u>: Nationwide Waiver to Allow Summer Food Service Program Reimbursement Rates for the Seamless Summer Option in Summer 2022

## USDA DoD Fresh Program Over the Summer Update

Recipient agencies (RAs) that would like to order USDA DoD Fresh for their Seamless Summer Operations may begin placing orders this week for delivery next week. Delivery days remain the same. RAs will need to use their NSLP allocations for SY 2022-2023 for these orders. The \$150 minimum per drop site still applies. All other protocol for the DoD Fresh Program must be followed. For specifics on the current contract, please review the <u>contract details</u>. There will likely be additional funding available later in the school year for the DoD Fresh Program.

## **USDA Foods Cut-up Chicken Cancellations**

The USDA continues to experience challenges in obtaining poultry products for SY23. After unsuccessfully receiving offers for cut-up chicken, material 111361, the USDA canceled the orders below in WBSCM. The Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is conducting market analysis to determine what quantities are available for future buys, specifically for delivery periods from October through December. Results from this analysis will assist in future chicken purchase schedules and hopefully ensure additional vendor participation. Please plan accordingly if you have any cases on these trucks. Continue to run weekly Requisition Status Reports so you can track what items have been purchased and canceled, as supply chain issues continue.

## CT Grown for CT Kids Grants
