This is a reminder that the comment period for the Proposed Rule *Child Nutrition Programs: Revisions to Meal Patterns Consistent with the 2020 Dietary Guidelines for Americans* closes on May 10, 2023. Comments can be submitted through the <u>Federal eRulemaking Portal</u>, following the online instructions for submitting comments. Instructions are also included for mail-in comments. Refer to Section 16 of the Rule to see a summary of the rule and a full list of the questions being asked. As noted in the proposed rule, the USDA intends to finalize the rule in 2024. USDA Memo SP 13-2023: Best Practices for Contracting with Food Service Management Companies

On April 21, 2023, the USDA released <u>USDA Memo SP 13-2023</u>: Best Practices for Contracting with Food Service Management Companies. This memorandum provides procurement-related technical assistance and information for school food authorities to consider when entering into and executing contracts with food service management companies.

USDA's Summer Meals Site Finder Starts May 4, 2023

The USDA's <u>Meals for Kids Site Finder (Summer Site Finder</u>) for will go live for the 2023 summer season on May 4, 2023. Families can use this tool to find directions to nearby meal sites, as well as their hours of operation and contact information. The map will be refreshed and published weekly.

Resource Roundup: CSDE's Training Program: What's in a Meal Module 6: Meal Pattern Documentation

This module is the sixth in the CSDE's *What's in a Meal* training program. Module 6 reviews the meal pattern documentation requirements for school meals. Topics include menus, production records, standardized recipes, and crediting documentation for commercial processed foods, i.e., Child Nutrition (CN) labels and product formulation statements (PFS), and the USDA's Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs. This module also describes resources for guidance and training on meal pattern documentation and includes a knowledge check on how to review the creditable ingredients in a PFS.
