Request to Extend the NSLP and/or SBP into the Summer Months (July and August): Due June 10, 2023

Local educational agencies (LEAs) may serve reimbursable lunches and/or breakfasts through an extension of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP) during the summer months (beyond June 30, 2023) if one of the following two criteria apply: 1) the school year is extended; or 2) an official required academic summer school program is in place.

LEAs requesting an extension of the NSLP and/or SBP during summer 2023 must consider the following:

- only students enrolled in the academic summer school program can receive meals;
- for students not directly certified, free and reduced-price meal applications must be approved to determine student eligibility;
- meals are claimed as free, reduced-price, or paid based on student eligibility;
- meals must be charged at the correct price (reduced price \$.30 breakfast or \$.40 lunch, district established paid lunch price);
- multiple meal distribution and non-congregate meals are **not** allowed;
- proper point-of-service meal counts are required (based on student eligibility);

- sites approved to operate the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) are eligible to request an
 extension and can utilize their approved claiming percentages to claim meals; and
- School Meals Assistance Revenue for Transition (SMART) Funds expire on June 30, 2023.

To be eligible to serve and claim reimbursable meals during summer due to an extension of the school year or a required academic summer school, **interested LEAs must submit an email requesting an extension of their NSLP and/or SBP** to Susan Alston at susan.alston@ct.gov by **June 10**, **2023**. The e-mail must include: 1) the schools requesting the extension; 2) the reason for the extension, e.g., academic summer school; and 3) the start and end date of the program.

Note: To submit July and/or August claims for reimbursement for the approved sites and dates, the LEA must first have an **approved** school year (SY) 2023-24 Sponsor Agreement. The CSDE will be providing a future e-mail with instructions on updating the SY 2023-24 Sponsor Agreement. **The LEA must submit the online agreement for CSDE approval by July 30, 2023, to submit the July claim for reimbursement.**

Final Reminder: 2023-24 Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement Due July 1, 2023

All public schools that participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) must submit the annual HFC Statement in the CSDE's Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System) by **July 1, 2023**.

 <u>Statement for School Year 2023-24</u> for important information and specific steps for completing the 2023-24 HFC Statement in the CNP System. **Note:** The **claims preparer** must first enroll the district in the school nutrition programs for school year 2023-24 before one of the two **authorized signers** can complete the HFC application.
- The HFC application requirements are summarized in <u>Operational Memorandum No. 08-23</u>: Requirements for Submitting the Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement for School Year 2023-24. Guidance is available in the CSDE's recorded training module, <u>Completing the Application Process for Healthy Food Certification</u>.

Final Reminder: 2023-24 Full-service Interschool Agreement Due July 1, 2023

Sponsors that sell USDA meals or Afterschool Snack Program (ASP) snacks to another district or school during school year 2023-24 must complete and submit an interschool agreement to the CSDE. These requirements are summarized in Operational Memorandum No. 07-23: Interschool Agreements for School Year 2023-24.

- The Full-service Interschool Agreement form must be submitted to the CSDE by July 1, 2023.
- The **Recipient Site Vended Interschool Agreements** must be submitted to the CSDE at least two weeks before the start of the school year, but no later than **August 30, 2023**.

The interschool agreement forms are available under "I" on the CSDE's <u>Forms for School Nutrition</u> <u>Programs</u> webpage.

NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant Opportunity: Due July 28, 2023

The CSDE is now accepting proposals for the **USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grants Request for Proposals (RFP)**. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Consolidated Appropriations Act (Public Law 117-103) provided funds to state agencies to competitively award equipment assistance grants to eligible school food authorities (SFAs) participating in the NSLP. These funds will allow SFAs to purchase equipment to serve healthier meals that meet the updated meal patterns, improve food safety, and expand access. Total funds available are \$692,832. The CSDE will award grants of up to \$50,000 per SFA.

For this grant, the previous free or reduced-price meals percentage eligibility requirement has been eliminated. *All* SFAs participating in the NSLP are eligible to apply. Priority is given to schools that did not receive previous equipment grant funding under earlier USDA NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants.

The RFP document was attached to the CSDE's e-mail from June 5, 2023 and is also available on the CSDE's 2023 Request for Proposals webpage.

Proposals must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 28, 2023. Extensions will not be given. Submit the application by e-mail to Sean Fogarty at Sean. Fogarty@ct.gov.

Operational Memorandum No. 12-23: State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant for School Year 2022-23

The CSDE's <u>Operational Memorandum No. 12-23</u> outlines the criteria for payment of the State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant and includes the list of school food authorities (SFAs) with sites that qualify for this grant. Summer Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT)

The CSDE and the Connecticut Department of Social Services (DSS) are in the process of receiving approval to operate the Summer P-EBT in summer 2023. Please note that all NSLP participating schools must continue to accept NSLP applications after the end of the current school year through September 2, 2023. Households applying on or before June 30, 2023, must use the school year 2022-23 school meals applications and income eligibility guidelines when processing school meals applications for the purposes of P-EBT eligibility. Households applying on or after July 1, 2023, will use the SY 2023-24 school meals applications and income eligibility guidelines. The CSDE will be collecting the data in the fall for any students made newly eligible for Summer P-EBT between June 30, 2023, and September 2, 2023. Thank you for your continued commitment to your students.

Reminder: Requirements for Field Trip Meals in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast

It is field trip season and SFAs are reminded that meals served on field trips must meet specific requirements to be reimbursable. SFAs must ensure that all school staff involved with field trips (including food service staff and non-food service staff such as teachers, teacher aides, and other applicable staff) understand and implement these requirements for offsite reimbursable meals. Refer to the CSDE's Requirements for Field Trip Meals in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for valuable information regarding allowable meal service methods and important tips for food safety and ensuring that meals are reimbursable, including point-of-service meal counts. Note: SFAs must have field trip standard operating procedures (SOPs) as part of the school's Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) plan.

UConn Rudd Center for Food Policy and Health Survey of Best Practices for Summer Meals Programs Outreach: Due June 22, 2023

The Rudd Center is conducting a <u>survey</u> on past and planned outreach efforts used to promote summer meals programs. The survey should take about 15-20 minutes to complete. The Rudd Center will use this information to develop best practices for Summer Meals Program promotion. Please submit the survey by June 22, 2023.

Resource Roundup: CSDE's Training Program: What's in a Meal Module 10: Vegetables Component

This module is the tenth in the CSDE's *What's in a Meal* training program and reviews the requirements and crediting information for the vegetables component. Topics include the required daily and weekly servings, vegetable subgroups, juice limit, and the crediting requirements for different types of vegetables (vegetable juice, raw leafy greens, canned vegetables, hominy, dried vegetables, pureed vegetables, soups, mixed vegetables, vegetable and fruit mixtures, and vegetable flour pasta), and noncreditable vegetables. This module also describes resources for guidance and training on the vegetables component and includes a knowledge check on crediting vegetables.
