Reminder: Submit USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grants Request for Proposals (RFP) by July 28, 2023

The deadline for the USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grants Request for Proposals (RFP) is **5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 28, 2023.** Extensions will not be given. Submit the application **by email** to Sean Fogarty at sean.fogarty@ct.gov.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Consolidated Appropriations Act (Public Law 117-103) provided funds to state agencies to competitively award equipment assistance grants to eligible school food authorities (SFAs) participating in the NSLP. These funds will allow SFAs to purchase equipment to serve healthier meals that meet the updated meal patterns, improve food safety, and expand access. Total funds available are \$692,832. The CSDE will award grants of up to \$50,000 per SFA.

For this grant, the previous free or reduced-price meals percentage eligibility requirement has been eliminated. All SFAs participating in the NSLP are eligible to apply. Priority is given to schools that did not receive previous equipment grant funding under earlier USDA NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants.

CSDE Job Announcement: Education Services Specialist for School Nutrition Programs

The CSDE is accepting applications for an Education Services Specialist (ESS) for the Bureau of Child Nutrition Programs (CNP), School Nutrition Programs team. The ESS is essential to the CSDE for operating programs that meet regulatory requirements, supporting access to USDA nutrition programs, and maintaining program integrity. This role will assist in administering the federal USDA school nutrition programs including the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), and the Food Distribution Program (FDP). Reminder: Meal Pattern Requirements for Preschoolers and Grades K-5 Eating Together in the NSLP or School Breakfast Program (SBP)

SFAs that serve reimbursable NSLP and SBP meals to preschoolers and grades K-5 in the **same service area** at the **same time** may choose one of the options below.

- 1. Use the grade-appropriate meal patterns for each grade group, i.e., use the preschool meal pattern for ages 1-4 and use the K-5 meal pattern for grades K-5.
- 2. Use the K-5 meal pattern for both groups.

SFAs must use the preschool meal patterns when meals are served to preschoolers in a different area or at a different time than older students. The USDA allows the option to serve the same meal pattern to preschoolers **only when preschoolers are co-mingled with K-5 students during the meal service**. The USDA strongly encourages schools to find ways to serve grade-appropriate meals to preschoolers and grades K-5 that best address their nutritional needs.
