CSDE Operational Memorandum 18-23: State Transition Assistance for Breakfast and Lunch Expenses (STABLE) Attestation Statement Due August 18, 2023

<u>CSDE Operational Memorandum 18-23</u> provides information and guidance on the State Transition Assistance for Breakfast and Lunch Expenses (STABLE) Attestation Statement, which is due **August 18, 2023**. Pursuant to Public Act No. 23-204 (Connecticut State Budget), \$16 million of federal American Rescue Plan Act (2021) funds has been allocated for "Free Meals for Students" to the CSDE for school year (SY) 2023-24. Through working with the Governor's Office and legislative leadership, these funds will be used to support households by allowing the provision of 1) breakfast meals at no cost to all students in non-Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) schools participating in the School Breakfast Program (SBP) and 2) lunch meals at no cost for students eligible for reduced-price meals in non-CEP schools that are participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). For SY 2023-24, under the NSLP and SBP, free and reduced-price meal eligibility will be determined for each individual student. Meals will be reimbursed based on a student's approved eligibility (free, reducedprice, and paid).

SDE's What's in a Meal Offer versus Serve(OVS) Training Modules Now Available

The CSDE's <u>What's in a Meal: National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program Meal</u> <u>Patterns for Grades K-12</u> is a series of 16 recorded training modules that provide comprehensive guidance on complying with the meal patterns for grades K-12 in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), and Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the NSLP. These modules are intended for school food service professionals in the NSLP, SBP, and SSO, including food service directors, managers, and staff.

The What's in a Meal modules on OVS are now available.

- **Module 15: Offer versus Serve (OVS) in the NSLP:** This module reviews the OVS requirements for the NSLP including the requirements for reimbursable lunches, menu planning considerations for the food components, identifying reimbursable meals, OVS with family-style meal service and salad bars, required signage, and OVS best practices and strategies for success. This module also describes resources for guidance and training on OVS and includes Meal or No Meal: Lunch Edition, a quiz on identifying reimbursable lunches with OVS.
- **Module 16: Offer versus Serve (OVS) in the SBP:** This module reviews the OVS requirements for the SBP. Topics include the requirements for reimbursable breakfasts, menu planning considerations, required signage, identifying reimbursable meals, and best practices for OVS. This module also describes resources for guidance and training on OVS and includes Meal or No Meal: Breakfast Edition, a quiz on identifying reimbursable breakfasts with OVS.
