Reminder: State Transition Assistance for Breakfast and Lunch Expenses (STABLE) Attestation Statement Due August 18, 2023

CSDE Operational Memorandum 18-23 provides information and guidance on the State Transition Assistance for Breakfast and Lunch Expenses (STABLE) Attestation Statement, which is due August 18, 2023. Pursuant to Public Act No. 23-204 (Connecticut State Budget), \$16 million of federal American Rescue Plan Act (2021) funds has been allocated for "Free Meals for Students" to the CSDE for school year (SY) 2023-24. Through working with the Governor's Office and legislative leadership, these funds will be used to support households by allowing the provision of 1) breakfast meals at no cost to all students in non-Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) schools participating in the School Breakfast Program (SBP) and 2) lunch meals at no cost for students eligible for reduced-price meals in non-CEP schools that are participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). For SY 2023-24, under the NSLP and SBP, free and reduced-price meal eligibility will be determined for each individual student. Meals will be reimbursed based on a student's approved eligibility (free, reduced-price, and paid).

Updating the Child Nutrition Program Sponsor Agreement for School Year (SY) 2023-24, due September 15, 2023

Instructions on updating the SY 2023-24 online agreement are available in the CSDE's manual, *Updating the Sponsor Application for School Nutrition Programs School Year 2023-24*. This manual also includes important instructions for completing the **Food Safety Inspection Report** and the annual **Financial Report**. *Please carefully review this information*.

To ensure timely approval, sponsor agreement renewals must be completed and submitted by **September 15, 2023.** As a reminder, **claims cannot be entered or submitted** without an approved agreement.

Please review the CSDE's <u>Checklist Summary</u> for a brief overview of materials that need to be uploaded to the Agreement before it can be reviewed and approved by the CSDE. Note that there is one additional form that must be uploaded for sponsors that collect free and reduced-price meal applications, the <u>Sample Parent/Guardian Notification Letter for Direct Certification</u>

<u>Version 3: Medicaid Benefits Reduced-price Meals</u>. This form must be uploaded under "<u>SNP Upload</u>." Questions may be directed to your <u>school nutrition team member</u>.

USDA Foods Update

Entitlement dollars for the USDA Foods DoD Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program for School Year (SY) 2023-24 have been loaded into FFAVORS. These entitlement dollars can be used for the remainder of the current Seamless Summer Option (SSO) as well as SY 2023-24. To change the point of contact or add any additional drop sites for this program, please contact the <u>Food Distribution Team</u>.

As a reminder, the new warehousing and delivery contract for Direct Delivery USDA Foods is now in effect. Hartford Provision Company (HPC) remains the vendor. The contract will be in effect from July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2026. The School Year 2023-24 Schedule of Direct Delivery USDA Foods was distributed by HPC on Monday, August 14, 2023, and is also available in the Documents and Forms section of the CSDE's the Food Distribution webpage. The new fees for the contract are indicated below.

- Delivery fee for 12 or more cases: \$5.29 per case
- Cost to pick-up USDA Foods at HPC: \$3.29 per case
- Flat delivery fee for Recipient Agencies ordering less than 12 cases: \$76.25

USDA School Meal Programs Menu Certification Worksheets for SY 2023-24

Link to the updated USDA menu certification worksheets for school year 2023-24 are now available in the "<u>Documents/Forms</u>" section of the CSDE's Certification of Meal Pattern Compliance for School Nutrition Programs webpage. The USDA made technical updates to all breakfast and lunch worksheets. An additional update was also made to the Simplified Nutrient Assessment tab of the lunch worksheets to align with Target 1A sodium limits that became effective on July 1, 2023.

Resource Roundup: Requirements for Production Records in School Nutrition Programs

As a reminder, the USDA regulations for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) (7 CFR 210.10(a)(3)) (including the Seamless Summer Option) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) (7 CFR 220.8(a)(3)) require that school food authorities (SFAs) must maintain daily production records for all school meals. The CSDE's resource, <u>Requirements for Production Records in School Nutrition</u> <u>Programs</u>, provide guidance on this requirement.

The CSDE offers a variety of sample production records for different grade configurations (including preschool and grades K-12) based on food items or food components. These forms help SFAs provide the information required to comply with the USDA's regulations for production records and are available in the "<u>Documents/Forms</u>" section of the CSDE's <u>Production Records for School Nutrition Programs</u>.
