


Action Items

Final Reminder: School Year 2023-24 Sponsor Agreements Due Friday, September 15, 2023

The school year 2023-24 Sponsor Agreements must be completed and submitted by Friday, September 15, 2023. **Note:** National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Afterschool Snack Program, and Special Milk Program claims for July and/or August cannot be entered or submitted without an approved agreement.

Applications that have been submitted and are ready for approval will have a **Packet Submitted Date** and will show "The Application Packet is currently under review by the State and is unavailable for changes" on the 2023-24 Application Packet dashboard. The school nutrition programs staff urge SFAs to review the CSDE's resources, <u>Updating the Sponsor Application for School Nutrition</u> <u>Programs</u> and <u>Required Items for the Online Sponsor Application "Checklist Summary,"</u> to troubleshoot application issues before contacting their school nutrition team member.

Advanced Placement (AP) Testing and Access to a Student's Eligibility for Free or Reduced-price Meals

On September 8, 2023, the Connecticut State Department of Education's (CSDE) Performance Office issued an email to all AP Coordinators. The relevant information is excerpted below. Please note that for the purposes of AP, PSAT, or SAT testing, the determining official may allow the school or district's AP coordinator access to a child's eligibility information. As a reminder, if the AP coordinator requests access, they must complete the <u>Disclosure Release Request for Free or Reduced Eligibility Status of</u> <u>Students in the School Nutrition Program form</u> before the determining official can approve access to this confidential information.

The process for obtaining fee waivers for eligible students for the College Board's Advanced Placement test has not changed. For 2024 Advanced Placement® (AP) testing, AP coordinators must order tests for students by **November 15, 2023**. This is the deadline to submit exam orders for all full-year and first-semester AP courses, and exam only sections. The late <u>order fee</u> applies for exams ordered after this date. A <u>fee</u> also applies for exams cancelled after this date. Please visit the <u>College Board's AP Central</u> for more information.

The CSDE and College Board will cover the <u>entire</u> cost of the **2024** AP exam fees for all students from low-income families who attend public school in Connecticut. The AP coordinators will indicate in the AP Registration and Ordering (APRO) site a student's low income status. Since the AP, PSAT, and SAT are considered part of a CSDE State Educational Program, the AP, PSAT, and SAT coordinator can be given access to a student's income eligibility status. To request access, the coordinator must complete the Disclosure Release form to ensure that they have an understanding of the USDA regulations and do not use this information for other purposes.

Please note that once the AP, PSAT, or SAT coordinator completes the <u>Disclosure Release</u> <u>Request for Free or Reduced Eligibility Status of Students in the School Nutrition Program</u> form and it is reviewed and approved by the district or school's determining official (the person that processes the free and reduced-price meal applications), they can access the free, reduced and paid information **directly via the CSDE's Public School Information System (PSIS)** without having the determining official provide them with a list of children who are eligible for free and reduced-price meals. *The deadline for the AP coordinator to indicate in APRO students who are eligible for the fee waiver is April 30, 2024.
