Action Items

Final Reminder: Complete Required Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Training for HFC Public Schools by September 30, 2023

As indicated in the <u>August 2, 2023, School Lunch Tray</u> and the CSDE approval email for the district's 2023-24 HFC Statement, the district's HFC contact person is required to compete the CSDE's <u>Complying with Healthy Food Certification</u> training program by **September 30, 2023**. The HFC contact person is the point person identified on the annual HFC Statement by the school district for coordinating the implementation and monitoring of the district's HFC (refer to the CSDE's <u>Responsibilities of District Contact Person for Healthy Food Certification</u>). This training program is also recommended for individuals that coordinate sales of competitive foods to students on school premises, such as food service directors and managers, culinary programs staff, fundraising coordinators, vending machine operators, and school store operators.

Need to Know

USDA Final Rule: Child Nutrition Programs: Community Eligibility Provision – Increasing Options for Schools

On September 26, 2023, the USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) published a final rule, <u>Child Nutrition Programs: Community Eligibility Provision – Increasing Options for Schools</u>. This final rule amends the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) regulations by lowering the minimum identified student percentage (ISP) from 40 percent to 25 percent. Lowering the minimum ISP will give states and schools greater flexibility to offer meals to all enrolled students at no cost when financially viable. Note: Since the final rule is effective after the June 30th CEP election deadline for school year (SY) 2023-24, the CSDE is required to request a waiver from FNS that will allow school food authorities (SFAs) to take advantage of the new minimum ISP during SY 2023-24. **The CSDE will issue an operational memorandum when additional information and guidance is received on implementing this final rule.**

Updated CSDE Resource: Servings for Grains/Breads in the Afterschool Snack Program Meal Pattern for Grades K-12

The CSDE's resource, <u>Servings for Grains/Breads in the Afterschool Snack Program Meal Pattern for Grades K-12</u>, has been updated. The saving size for Group H (cereal grains) was incorrectly listed in ounce equivalents instead of grains/breads servings. The revised version (dated September 2023) has the correct amounts:

- 1 serving = ½ cup cooked (or 25 grams dry)
- ½ serving = ½ cup cooked (or 13 grams dry)

Resource Roundup: County Assignments for School Nutrition Programs

Each Connecticut county has an assigned CSDE school nutrition team member to provide technical assistance for the school nutrition programs (refer to the CSDE's <u>County Assignments for School Nutrition Programs</u>). This is the person SFAs should contact with any questions about operating the school nutrition programs.

Good to Know

Reminder: USDA's Farm to School Census is coming in October

The USDA FNS will release the fourth Farm to School Census (Census) in October 2023, and everyone's participation counts. Data collected through the Census truly shapes the future of farm to school. State, local, and federal governments, researchers, advocates, and more use Census data to inform future legislation, investments, and programs.

This year, Census surveys will be "sharable" for the first time, so SFAs can leverage the help of their partners in gathering accurate data on their district or schools' farm to school activities. The USDA encourages SFAs to collaborate with partners they engage with in school gardens, farm field trips, curriculum development, and more to share a comprehensive farm to school story through the Census.

New food service directors can review the <u>2019 Farm to School Census results</u> for their district to get inspired about the power of the Census and explore the data at the state and district level.
