Reminder for NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant Applicants to Submit Purchase Orders

As a reminder, NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant Applicants must email their signed purchase orders for equipment to sean.fogarty@ct.gov before starting a request within the Connecticut eGrants Management System (eGMS). The CSDE will issue the official award notifications for reimbursements through the eGMS. To initiate this process, successful applicants must provide a signed purchase order for their equipment and email to sean.fogarty@ct.gov.

Participate in the 2023 Farm to School Census

The USDA's Patrick Leahy Farm to School Program is conducting the fourth Farm to School Census (The Census). Surveys were emailed in early October. The Census is the only national survey that examines local food purchasing, gardens, and agricultural education in schools. USDA encourages all public, private, and charter schools operating the National School Lunch Program in all 50 states and territories, to participate and make sure #LocalCounts. Census data, including trends, economic impacts, and challenges, is often used to inform decisions made by local, state, and national decision leaders. Need to Know

Local Educational Agencies Experiencing Milk Supply Shortages or Other Milk Emergencies

The CSDE was recently notified about a shortage in milk cartons that may cause distributors to limit the milk that is delivered to schools. As a reminder, if there is an emergency with providing milk during breakfast or lunch service, local educational agencies (LEAs) must notify and receive approval from the CSDE's Bureau of Child Nutrition Programs before providing a meal that does not offer milk as part of the reimbursable meal. Under the current regulations for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) (7 CFR 210.10(d)(2)), School Breakfast Program (SBP) (220.8(d)), Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) (225.16(f)(6)) and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) (226.20(e)(1)), state agencies may allow LEAs experiencing emergencies involving milk to serve meals during an emergency period with an alternate form of fluid milk or without fluid milk.

Although LEAs are expected to meet the fluid milk requirements to the greatest extent possible, there may circumstances that prevent LEAs from offering milk as part of the reimbursable meal including supply chain disruptions, such as disruptions that limit milk variety or affect serving size, milk delivery problems, or milk quality issues.

LEAs that are experiencing issues with offering milk should contact their school nutrition team member and copy Shannon Yearwood, Bureau Chief, Child Nutrition Programs. The email should include the information below.

- 1. The reason milk cannot be served.
- 2. The schools impacted.
- 3. The meal service impacted (i.e., breakfast, lunch, or both).
- 4. The estimated timeframe that milk will not be served.

USDA Memo TA 01-2024: Crediting Traditional Indigenous Foods in Child Nutrition Programs

Today, USDA released <u>TA 01-2024</u>: <u>Crediting Traditional Indigenous Foods in Child Nutrition Programs</u>. This memorandum supersedes TA 01-2015: Child Nutrition Programs and Traditional Foods. It includes an updated and expanded list of traditional Indigenous foods, such as beaked hazelnuts, steamed lambsquarters, and wild raspberries, that credit the same as similar foods currently included in the <u>Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs (FBG)</u>. This memorandum is part of the USDA's effort to promote serving traditional Indigenous Foods in Child Nutrition Programs and will also be available on the USDA's previously released <u>Serving Traditional Indigenous Foods in Child Nutrition Programs</u> webpage. The FBG was updated in May 2023 with the addition of traditional Indigenous foods similar to foods already included in the FBG.
