#### **Need to Know**

USDA Memo SFSP 03-2024 and SP 05-2024: Implementation Guidance for the Rural Non-congregate Option Provisions of the Interim Final Rule, Establishing the Summer EBT Program and Rural Non-Congregate Option in the Summer Meal Programs

USDA Memo SFSP 03-2024 and SP 05-2024 provides guidance on the new regulatory requirements for non-congregate summer meal service in rural areas, as authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (PL 117-328). This Act amended section 13 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 USC 1761, to include the authorization of a permanent, rural non-congregate meal service through the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) which the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) is extending to the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Seamless Summer Option (SSO). Per the statutory requirement, on December 29, 2023, FNS published an interim final rule, Establishing the Summer EBT Program and Rural Non-Congregate Option in the Summer Meal Programs. This rulemaking, effective December 29, 2023, codified the permanent rural non-congregate summer meal service for both SFSP and SSO, and created the Summer Electronic Benefits Transfer for Children Program (summer EBT). While non-congregate summer meal service for rural areas was initially implemented through FNS guidance during summer 2023, that guidance is superseded by the interim final rule.

# USDA Memo SFSP 04-2024 and SP 06-2024: Rural Designations in the Summer Meal Programs – Revised

<u>USDA Memo SFSP 04-2024</u> and <u>SP 06-2024</u> provides revised guidance on rural designations in the SFSP and SSO. This memorandum is updated to include revisions to the definition of rural as provided in the interim final rule, <u>Establishing the Summer EBT Program and Rural Non-Congregate Option in the Summer Meal Programs</u>. This memorandum supersedes SFSP policy memorandum SFSP 17-2015, Rural Designations in the Summer Food Service Program – Revised, April 21, 2017.

# Local Food for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reporting Requirements: Report of January 2024 Purchases due February 16, 2024

Districts that would like to receive reimbursement from their LFSIP funds allocation for purchases of locally grown or produced foods for the month of December 2023 must submit the <u>Monthly Local Foods for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reporting Form - Phase 1</u>. Purchases made in December 2023 should be reported on the form by Friday, February 16, 2024.

# New Features and Food Yields in the Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs Interactive Web-based Tool

Two new features have been added to the <u>Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs (FBG)</u> Interactive Web-based Tool. Both features are available under the Tools menu on the toolbar.

- Interactive flow chart on using the preparation yield walks users through when to use the Preparation Yield factor in the Recipe Analysis Workbook (RAW).
- An Ounces to Pounds Calculator allows users to easily convert ounces to pounds and pounds to ounces to make converting units simple.

New foods are available in the FBG: New additions consist of USDA Foods frozen mixed vegetables and a variety of meat items including 11-, 43-, and 48-ounce pouched tuna; boneless, skinless chicken thighs; ground mutton, mutton shoulder chops and stew meat; catfish fillets; and USDA Foods canned pork.

### **Resource Roundup: Sample Letter to Request Food Safety Inspection**

Section 9(h) of the NSLA, 42 U.S.C. 1758(h) requires that at least twice a year, schools must obtain a food safety inspection conducted by a state or local agency responsible for such inspections. When two health inspections are not conducted, the SFA is responsible for requesting the inspections and documenting these efforts (refer to the CSDE's <u>Sample Letter for Food Safety Health Inspection for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP)</u>). Retain a copy of the letter/email sent to the health department to document attempts to comply with this regulation.
