Reminder: 2024-25 Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement Due July 1, 2024

All public schools that participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) must submit the annual HFC Statement in the CSDE's Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System) by July 1, 2024.

 the 2023-24 HFC Statement in the CNP System. Note: The claims preparer must first enroll the
 district in the school nutrition programs for school year 2024-25 before one of the two authorized
 signers can complete the HFC application.

 Requirements for Submitting the Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement for School Year

Reminder: Interschool Agreements for School Year 2024-25 Due July 1, 2024 (Full Service) or August 30, 2024 (Vended)

Sponsors that sell USDA meals or Afterschool Snack Program (ASP) snacks to another district or school during school year 2024-25 must complete and submit an interschool agreement to the CSDE.

- Full-service Interschool Agreement form: Due July 1, 2024.
- Recipient Site Vended Interschool Agreements: Due at least two weeks before the start of the school year, but no later than August 30, 2024.

Reminder: USDA Foods Transfer Request Forms

With the end of the school year approaching, the Connecticut Food Distribution Program's (FDP) staff are getting requests for additional pounds at processors to finish the year. CSDE <u>Operational Memorandum No. 02-19</u> summarizes the FDP's procedure for requesting transfer of pounds of USDA Foods diverted for further processing. Recipient Agencies (RAs) must complete and submit the <u>USDA Foods Transfer Request Form</u> when requesting any transfers. This form assists RAs with critically reviewing current usage and forecasting projected usage.

Requests must come from the RAs directly. The FDP will not accept requests from processors or brokers. The FDP staff will review the request and contact the RA with any questions or additional instructions. The RA will receive an email notification if the requested pounds are available and the transfer request is approved.
