The CSDE's <u>FFVP Grant Announcement</u> provides information regarding the 2024-25 FFVP grant opportunity. The FFVP provides funding to serve a variety of free fresh fruit and vegetable snacks to all children in participating schools. **This grant funded program is different from the USDA Foods DOD program.**

Submission Process: The 2024-25 FFVP Applications must be completed and submitted in the Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (<u>CNP System</u>). Applicants must have a user ID and password to access the system or connect with a district staff member who has current access. The <u>Instructions for Submitting the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) Grant Application</u> describes how to enter and submit the completed application.

- Applicants must complete and upload the <u>Application Certification</u> form.
- Schools must be **elementary** schools to apply, which are defined as schools inclusive of any grade between kindergarten and grade 6 (e.g., Pre-K-6, K-12, and 5-8) where at least **50 percent** of the children are eligible for free and reduced-price meals.
- The <u>FFVP Area Eligibility List</u> and <u>FFVP Site Eligibility List</u> are specific to the FFVP grant only, and will assist school food authorities in determining which schools are potentially eligible to participate in the FFVP.

New Connecticut Local Food for School Incentive Program

In addition to the federally funded program currently administered by CSDE, state funding has been allocated to support locally and regionally sourced food. This program is administered by the Connecticut Department of Agriculture (CT DOAG) in cooperation with CSDE.

<u>The Connecticut Local Food for Schools Incentive Program</u> provides reimbursement payments to eligible boards of education for the purchase of **locally sourced food** and **regionally sourced food** to be used in an eligible meal program. An eligible board of education shall be entitled to receive reimbursement payments in an amount equal to:

- one-half of such board's expenditures for locally sourced foods and
- one-third of such board's expenditures for regionally sourced foods

Any eligible board of education interested in participating in the program must complete the <u>CT DOAG</u> <u>Microsoft Office form</u>. This is a non-competitive program, but eligible boards of education must opt-in to participate or affirmatively opt-out of participating.

There are some differences between the two incentive programs. Detailed guidance and a presentation are available on the <u>CT DOAG webpage</u>. The Connecticut Local Food for School Incentive Program runs from May 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

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To file a program discrimination complaint, a Complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at: https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf, from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation. The completed AD-3027 form or letter must be submitted to USDA by:
