Action Items

Onsite Monitoring for School Year 2024-25 Must be Completed by February 1, 2025

The onsite monitoring requirements for school year 2024-25 for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), Afterschool Snack Program (ASP), and Food Service Management Company (FSMC) operations must be completed by **February 1, 2025**. All monitoring forms are available under "Monitoring Forms" on the CSDE's Forms for School Nutrition Programs webpage, and the applicable sections of each webpage indicated below.

Onsite Monitoring of the NSLP and SBP

Section 7 CFR 210.8(a)(1) requires that each school food authority (SFA) with more than one school must perform no less than one on-site review of the NSLP's and SBP's counting and claiming system, including the general areas of review for each school under its jurisdiction. While all schools participating in the NSLP must be reviewed annually, a minimum of 50 percent of schools operating the SBP must be monitored annually, with every SBP school monitored at least once every two years.

All sites being claimed for federal reimbursement must be included in the onsite review process (i.e., schools that participate via an interschool agreement with another SFA). The annual on-site reviews must take place **prior to February 1** of each school year. If the review discloses problems with a school's meal counting and claiming procedures or general review areas, the SFA must ensure that the school implements corrective action, which includes conducting a follow-up on-site review within 45 days of the original review, to determine that the corrective action resolved the problems.

Onsite monitoring forms for the NSLP (<u>On-site School Review Checklist for the NSLP</u>) and SBP (<u>On-site School Review Checklist for the SBP</u>) are available in the "<u>Monitoring Forms</u>" section of the CSDE's Meal Counting and Claiming for School Nutrition Programs website.

Onsite Monitoring of the ASP

Sponsors that participate in the ASP must review each ASP a minimum of two times each year. The reviews must assess each site's compliance with the appropriate USDA meal pattern (grades K-12 and preschoolers) and counting and claiming procedures.

- **First review:** The SFA must complete the first review within the first four weeks of ASP program operation each school year.
- **Second review:** The SFA must complete a second review sometime during the remainder of the time that the ASP is in operation.

The SFA must keep signed and dated copies of the completed on-site monitoring forms on file, including detailed findings and corrective action. If problems are found during the reviews, the SFA must assign corrective action and conduct at least one follow-up review to ensure that corrective

action has been implemented. The CSDE's <u>ASP Onsite Monitoring Form</u> is available in the "Documents/Forms" section of the CSDE's <u>ASP</u> webpage.

Onsite Monitoring of FSMC Operations

Section 7 CFR 210.16(a)(3) requires sponsors that contract with a FSMC to monitor the food service operation through periodic on-site visits. SFAs must monitor each site at least twice per school year. The monitoring process must include completing the CSDE's monitoring form, or a form approved by CSDE. This requirement is in addition to the SBP/NSLP on-site monitoring requirement (mentioned above) which must be completed prior to February 1. SFAs may choose to complete one FSMC monitoring visit at the same time as the NSLP visit. Both FSMC on-site monitoring visits must be completed prior to the end of the school year. Completing the monitoring visits and forms are the SFA's responsibility.

For audit purposes, the SFA must keep signed and dated copies of the completed on-site monitoring forms on file, including detailed findings and corrective action. This document will be requested by the CSDE during a FSMC Monitoring Review or full Procurement Review. The CSDE's School Food Authority/Food Service Management Company Monitoring Form is available under "Monitoring" in the "Contracts in School Nutrition Programs "section of the CSDE's FSMC webpage.

Local Food for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Phase 2

The CSDE is pleased to announce <u>LFSIP Phase 2 reimbursement allocations</u> for school food authorities (SFAs) that elected to participate. The goal of Phase 2 is to engage with socially disadvantaged or small business producers to establish a sustainable, long-term procurement relationship. Phase 2 participants will receive personalized support, training, and guidance from the newly launched Regional Farm to School Coordinators as well as the consultants at CSDE, and staff at the Connecticut Department of Agriculture, and the University of Connecticut Cooperative Extension. A Regional Farm to School Coordinator will reach out to you in the next few weeks to provide technical assistance and support.

Save the Date: Webinar on Rudd Center's New Wellness School Assessment Tool (WellSAT) Website

On February 6 2025, from 2:00 – 3:00 p.m., the University of Connecticut Rudd Center for Food Policy and Health will conduct a webinar on their new WellSAT website. More details are coming soon.

As a reminder, the USDA's final rule, <u>Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010</u>, requires that each local LEA must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. The first LSWP assessment in CT was required by June 30, 2022. The second triennial assessment is due June 30, 2025. The LSWP Triennial Assessments are completed on the Rudd Center's WellSAT webpage.
