Reminder: Webinar on Rudd Center's New Wellness School Assessment Tool (WellSAT) Website

On February 6, 2025, from 2:00 – 3:00 p.m., the University of Connecticut Rudd Center for Food Policy and Health will conduct a webinar on their new WellSAT website. As a reminder, the USDA's final rule, Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010, requires that each local LEA must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. The first LSWP assessment in CT was required by June 30, 2022. The second triennial assessment is due June 30, 2025. The LSWP Triennial Assessments are completed on the Rudd Center's WellSAT webpage.

New CSDE Resource: County Assignments for Summer Meals

Each Connecticut county has an assigned CSDE Summer Meals team member to provide technical assistance for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). Dietary Guidelines for Americans, 2020-2025 Continuing Professional Education Self-Study Modules

The <u>Dietary Guidelines for Americans</u>, 2020-2025 Continuing Professional Education Self-Study <u>Modules</u> allows individuals to obtain continuing professional education (CPE) credits for reading the Dietary Guidelines for Americans, 2020-2025. Credits are provided by the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR), the credentialing body for Registered Dietitians and Dietetic Technicians, Registered. The self-study modules will equip professionals with knowledge of the scientific underpinnings that make the Dietary Guidelines relevant across all life stages. These CPE activities expire on April 22, 2027.
