Final Reminder: Introduction to School Nutrition Leadership Training Survey: Due March 14, 2025

Note that this training was previously referred to as the "new director's training."

Reminder: Federal Local Food for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reporting Requirements: Report of February 2025 Purchases Due March 14, 2025

Districts that would like to receive reimbursement from their LFSIP funds allocation for purchases of locally grown or produced foods for the month of February 2025 must submit the <u>Federal Local Foods</u> for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reimbursement Request Form (Phase 1&2). Purchases made in February 2025 must be reported on the form by **Friday, March 14, 2025**. As a reminder, the following items are not allowed for reimbursement: fluid milk; baked goods including bread and rolls; or items that cannot be attributed to a specific farm or producer.

CSDE Office Hours on the Triennial Assessment using the Wellness School Assessment Tool (WellSAT) Website: Monday, March 17, 2025

Join the CSDE on Monday, March 17, 2025, from 2:00-3:00 p.m. for office hours on the Triennial Assessment using the WellSAT website. As a reminder, the USDA's final rule, <u>Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010</u>, requires that each local LEA must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. The second triennial assessment is due **June 30**, **2025**, and is conducted using WellSAT.

Termination Notice for Agreement No. AM25CPLFS000C010 for the Project Titled, Local Food for Schools and Child Care Cooperative Agreement (LFSCC)

The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) received notification from US Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service on March 7, 2025, that the upcoming Local Food for Schools and Child Care Cooperative Agreement (LFSCC) opportunity has been cancelled due to changes in USDA priorities. That opportunity was planned to go into effect later in 2025.

This change in LFSCC does **not** affect the current federal Local Food for School Incentive Program (LFSIP) Phase 1 and 2 funding in place and continuing until April 30, 2025. However, programs should utilize their allotted funds as soon as possible by April 30, 2025.

The Connecticut LFSIP is state funded, and, therefore, not impacted by the termination of the federal LFSCC program.

The CSDE's <u>Regional Farm to School Coordinators</u> stand ready to support all SFAs with navigating the federal LFSIP and Connecticut LFSIP. USDA Memo SP 09-2025: Buy American Accommodation Process for School Year 2025-2026

<u>USDA Memo SP 09-2025</u> provides guidance on the accommodation process in <u>7 CFR 210.21(d)(8)</u> and <u>7 CFR 220.16(d)(8)</u>. This memorandum provides the state agency the ability to approve temporary relief for school food authorities (SFAs) that demonstrate they cannot meet the thresholds for non-domestic food purchases established in regulations 7 CFR 210.21(d)(5) and 7 CFR 220.16(d)(5) for school year 2025-2026.

Schedule of Program Year 2025 Summer Meal Programs Trainings

The table below includes the 10 webinars comprising the CSDE Summer Meal Programs Annual Training. Not all sessions are required for all potential Summer Meal Programs sponsors. Half of the sessions are for **all** potential sponsors and half are **specific** to either SSO or SFSP potential

sponsors. To avoid confusion and ensure compliance with federal regulations, the CSDE strongly encourages potential sponsors to:

- clearly specify the program they intend to operate in Program Year 2025;
- attend all general sessions; and
- only participate in the topic-specific sessions related to the Summer Meal Program their organization plans to operate.

Live participation is the best learning opportunity and strongly encouraged by the CSDE. All webinars will be recorded and posted to the "Annual Training" section of the CSDE's SFSP webpage to accommodate true unavoidable scheduling conflicts. The SFSP Meal Patterns webinar is prerecorded and may be completed at the sponsor's convenience, prior to May 1, 2025, in preparation for the SFSP application.



How to Check Funding Status of Federal and State Reimbursements

The CSDE's Grant Management system has a webpage that allows SFAs to check the status of their Child Nutrition Program funds. Information regarding this process may be found on page 20 of the CSDE's <u>Guide to Financial Management Requirements for the School Nutrition Programs</u>, which contains information and resources to help SFAs comply with the federal and state regulations for financial management of the USDA's school nutrition programs. As a reminder, the USDA final rule, <u>Child Nutrition Programs: Meal Patterns Consistent With the 2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for Americans</u>, requires changes to the school meal patterns effective July 1, 2025, with some additional changes effective later. The CSDE's resource, <u>Summary of Final Rule Updates to the Meal Patterns for the School Nutrition Programs</u>, summarizes the meal patterns changes for each grade group (grades K-12 and preschool) and program (National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and Afterschool Snack Program) and their effective dates.
