Save the Date for CSDE Training Session: Overview of the Final Rule Meal Pattern Changes for the School Nutrition Programs, May 1, 2025

The USDA final rule, Child Nutrition Programs: Meal Patterns Consistent With the 2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for Americans, required changes to the meal patterns for the school nutrition programs (grades K-12 and preschool) beginning July 1, 2024. Additional changes are effective with school year 2025-26, beginning July 1, 2025. This session will discuss the current and upcoming meal pattern changes for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) meal patterns for grades K-12, and the NSLP, SBP, and Afterschool Snack Program (ASP) preschool meal patterns. Resources to assist SFAs with implementation will also be identified.

Save the Date for CSDE Training Session: Meal Pattern and Implementation Updates for the Afterschool Snack Program for School Year 2025-26, May 15, 2025

Effective with school year 2025-26 (beginning July 1, 2025), the USDA final rule, <u>Child Nutrition Programs: Meal Patterns Consistent With the 2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for Americans</u>, makes significant changes to the current ASP meal pattern for grades K-12 by aligning it with the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) snack meal pattern for children. The first part of this session will review the new ASP meal pattern requirements for grades K-12 and highlight resources to assist SFAs with implementation. The second part of this session will discuss the USDA's operational requirements for the ASP.

Operational Memorandum No. 06-25: State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant for School Year 2024-25

The CSDE's Operational Memorandum No. 06-25 outlines the criteria for payment of the State Severe Need School Breakfast Program Grant and includes the list of school food authorities (SFAs) with sites that qualify for this grant. USDA Foods Orders for School Year 2025-26

Now that all RAs have placed their orders for next school year, the FDP team is working on organizing the orders into full truckloads or finding nearby states to share trucks. During this time, RAs may get automated email notifications from WBSCM about changes in the amount of food (cases or pounds) or cancellations. Please remember that all orders can change until they are fully purchased.

Direct delivery orders for Connecticut should be finished by the end of April. Processing orders should be completed before the new school year starts. For planning, RAs should begin running monthly Requisition Status Reports for next school year starting May 1. It is important to review these reports regularly to keep track of any order changes.

WBSCM updates the purchase price of items regularly. This can change until the item is fully purchased and moved to the "purchased" status. While the order is still in progress, RAs may notice changes in their entitlement due to cancellations, adjustments in the amounts ordered, or changes in pricing. The entitlement will keep changing until all items are purchased. RAs are responsible for ordering at least 95 percent of their available entitlement when placing orders, but changes are expected. Please continue to monitor USDA Foods for next year and contact the FDP team with any questions.

USDA Foods Direct Delivery Inventory at HPC

Only three deliveries remain for the current school year. Recipient Agencies (RAs) that have not taken delivery of at least 60 percent of their inventory at this time may have product swept from their account. All inventory must be taken by June deliveries. Please contact the <u>Food Distribution Program (FDP) team</u> with any questions.

Resource Roundup: Requirements for Field Trip Meals in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program

Meals served on field trips must meet specific requirements to be reimbursable. School food authorities (SFAs) must ensure that all school staff involved with field trips (including food service staff and non-food service staff such as teachers, teacher aides, and other applicable staff) understand and implement these requirements for off-site reimbursable meals. The CSDE's Requirements for Field Trip Meals in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program provides guidance on allowable meal service methods for field trips and important tips for food safety and ensuring that meals are reimbursable, including point-of-service meal counts.
