Districts that would like to receive reimbursement from their LFSIP funds allocation for purchases of locally grown or produced foods for the months of April and May 2025 must submit the <u>Federal Local Foods for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reimbursement Request Form (Phase 1 & 2).</u>
Purchases made in April and May 2025 must be reported on the form by Friday, May 30, 2025.

National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Required Sponsor Online Application Training: June 3, 2025

This is a friendly reminder that the NSLP Sponsor Online Application Training will take place **June 3**, **2025**, from 1:00 to 3:00 pm. This training is required for all sponsors of the NSLP. At least one staff member from each school food authority with responsibilities for completing the annual update of the child nutrition programs sponsor application is required to attend.

Save the Date for the CSDE Training Session in Collaboration with the University of Connecticut Rudd Center: June 12, 2025

Join the CSDE and the UConn Rudd Center for an informative training session designed to guide school staff through the process of completing the Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Triennial Assessment Summary. The topic of the webinar is: *How to Complete the Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Triennial Assessment Summary* and will take place Wednesday, June 12, 2025, from 2:00 – 3:00 pm.

As a reminder, the USDA's final rule, <u>Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) Implementation Under the HHFKA of 2010</u>, requires that each local educational agency (LEA) must complete an assessment of their LSWP at least once every three years. **The second triennial assessment is due June 30**, **2025**, and is conducted using Wellness School Assessment Tool (WellSAT). Requests to Extend the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP) into the Summer Months (July and August) due June 13, 2025

Local educational agencies (LEAs) may serve reimbursable lunches and/or breakfasts through an extension of the NSLP and/or SBP during the summer months (beyond June 30, 2025) if one of the following two criteria apply: 1) the school year is extended; or 2) an official required academic summer school program is in place.

LEAs requesting an extension of the NSLP and/or SBP during summer 2025 must consider the following:

- only students enrolled in the extended school year or academic summer school program can receive meals;
- for sites not operating under the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a student's school year 2024-25 free and reduced-price eligibility by direct certification or free or reduced-price meal application will be used for the counting and claiming of meals;
- meals will be claimed as free, reduced-price, or paid based on student eligibility;
- meals must be charged at the correct price (reduced price \$.30 breakfast or \$.40 lunch, district established paid lunch price);
- multiple meal distribution and non-congregate meals are **not** allowed;
- proper point-of-service meal counts are required (based on student eligibility);
- sites approved to operate the CEP must utilize their approved claiming percentages to claim meals; and
- State Transition Assistance for Reduced-price (STAR) Funds expire on June 30, 2025.

To be eligible to serve and claim reimbursable meals during summer due to an extension of the school year or a required academic summer school, **interested LEAs must submit an email requesting an extension of their NSLP and/or SBP** to Jen Bove at jennifer.bove@ct.gov by **June 13, 2025**.

The email must include:

- 1. the schools requesting the extension;
- 2. the reason for the extension, e.g., academic summer school;
- 3. the meal or meals the site will be serving (breakfast only, lunch only, breakfast and lunch); and
- 4. the start and end date of the program.

Note: To submit July and/or August claims for reimbursement for the approved sites and dates, the LEA must first have an **approved** school year (SY) 2025-26 Sponsor Agreement. The CSDE will be providing a future e-mail with instructions on updating the SY 2025-26 Sponsor Agreement. **The LEA must submit the online agreement for CSDE approval by July 30, 2025, to submit the July claim for reimbursement.**

Chef Ann Foundation Bulk Milk Grants for Schools Due June 26, 2025

The USDA requires schools to offer students milk with every lunch or breakfast the schools serve. Most schools today serve milk in disposable cartons or plastic bottles. With over 31 million lunches and over 13 million breakfasts served every single school day, year after year, milk packaging and liquid waste is one of the biggest sources of waste generated by school food programs.

The Chef Ann Foundation's Bulk Milk grants provide eligible schools across the country nearly everything they need to transition from serving milk in single-use cartons or bottles to serving milk in bulk.
