Federal Local Food for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reporting Requirements: Report of April, May, and June 2025 Purchases Deadline Extended to July 3, 2025

Districts that would like to receive reimbursement from their LFSIP funds allocation for purchases of locally grown or produced foods for the months of **April, May, and June 2025** must submit the <u>Federal Local Foods for Schools Incentive Program (LFSIP) Reimbursement Request Form (Phase 1&2)</u>. Purchases made in **April, May, and June 2025** must be reported on the form by **Thursday, July 3, 2025**. As a reminder, the following items are not allowed for reimbursement: fluid milk; baked goods including bread and rolls; or items that cannot be attributed to a specific farm or producer.

Final Reminder: Introduction to School Nutrition Leadership Virtual Training on August 5, 12, and 19, 2025

This is the final reminder regarding registration for upcoming virtual training, **Introduction to School Nutrition Leadership**, on August 5, 12, and 19, 2025, from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm. The CSDE is hosting the Institute of Child Nutrition's (ICN) <u>Introduction to School Nutrition Leadership Lite</u>, a three-day no cost virtual training program planned specifically for new and aspiring directors of the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs. This webinar will be conducted by school nutrition program consultant, Lonnie Burt.

All school nutrition directors hired within the past year are required to take part in the virtual Introduction to School Nutrition Leadership training program. This training will provide an overview of the many responsibilities of the school nutrition director. The goal is to build the new director's knowledge base, provide multiple tools and resources, allow opportunities to network, and improve confidence in operating the school nutrition programs.

USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grants Request for Proposals (RFP) Due July 25, 2025

The CSDE is now accepting proposals for the USDA NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants RFP. All SFAs participating in the NSLP are eligible to apply. Priority is given to schools that did not receive previous equipment grant funding under earlier USDA NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants. Total funds available are \$108,255. The CSDE will award grants of at least \$1,000 and up to \$15,000 per SFA. The RFP document is available on the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) 2025 Request for Proposals webpage. The deadline is July 25, 2025.

Updated Five-day Preschool Lunch Menu Form for Ages 1-2 in the NSLP

The CSDE posted an updated version of the <u>Five-day Preschool Lunch Menu Form for Ages 1-2 in the NSLP</u> to correct a typo. The serving size for vegetables and fruit was incorrectly listed as ¼ cup instead of ½ cup. Please discard any previous versions and replace them with the updated version.

Updated CSDE Production Records for Grades K-12 and Preschool in the NSLP and SBP for School Year 2025-26

As a reminder, the USDA regulations for the NSLP (7 CFR 210.10(a)(3)) (including the Seamless Summer Option) and SBP (7 CFR 220.8(a)(3)) require that all school food authorities (SFAs) must maintain daily production records for all school meals. The CSDE's resource, Requirements for Production Records in School Nutrition Programs, provided guidance on this requirement.

Updated versions (dated July 2025) of the CSDE's production records for grades K-12 in the NSLP and SBP are available in the "<u>Production Record Forms</u>" section of the CSDE's Production Records for School Nutrition Programs.
