Correction to Overview of Menu Planning for Grades K-12 in the School Breakfast Program

The CSDE corrected a typo on page 4 of the [Overview of Menu Planning for Grades K-12 in the School Breakfast Program](#).

- **Incorrect:** Breakfast menus must offer at least ½ cup of fruits daily for grades K-5 and 6-8, and at least 1 cup daily for grades 9-12.
- **Correct:** Breakfast menus must offer at least 1 cup of fruits daily for all grades.

CEP has been shown to strengthen food security, improve children's diet, and bolster school meal participation, all while reducing administrative and operational burdens for school nutrition departments. The 2024-2025 school year saw significant increases in CEP adoption nationwide.
