Triennial Assessment (Due June 30, 2025) and Reporting Form Due September 15, 2025

As a reminder, all sponsors were federally required to complete the triennial assessment of their Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) by June 30, 2025, and to make the results publicly available. This includes posting the assessment summary on the organization's website or sharing it through other public channels.

In addition, the CSDE requires all sponsors to complete the <u>Triennial Assessment Reporting Form</u> by September 15, 2025. This reporting form allows the CSDE to track sponsor compliance with federal requirements related to the triennial assessment and public disclosure of LSWP implementation.

School Year (SY) 2025-26 Free and Reduced-Price Application Materials

The CSDE has posted the updated school year (SY) 2025-26 free and reduced-price application materials in the "<u>Application Forms</u>" section and "<u>Parent and Guardian Notification Letters</u>" section of the CSDE's Eligibility for Free and Reduced-price Meals and Free Milk in School Nutrition Programs webpage. All forms are effective as of August 1, 2025.

- How to Fill Out the Application Parent/Guardian Video: The CSDE's parent/guardian video, How to Fill Out the Application for Free and Reduced-price Meals or Free Milk and Summer EBT, is a brief video helping parents and guardians complete the free and reduced-price application form. Sponsors are encouraged to provide a link to this video on the school or district's website.
- **Public/Media Release:** The Public/Media Release template is available under <u>Forms for School Nutrition Programs</u>.
- Web-based Applications: Sponsors using web-based applications are reminded to review
 the CSDE's document, <u>Requirements Before Implementing Web-based Applications</u>. This
 guidance outlines key requirements for implementing web-based online free and reduced-price
 meal application systems.
- New S-EBT Guidance Document: The CSDE has developed a new resource, <u>Student</u>
 <u>Eligibility for Free or Reduced-price Meal Benefits Through the Summer Electronic Benefit</u>
 <u>Transfer (S-EBT) Program</u>, to clarify student eligibility for free or reduced-price meals via S-

EBT. Starting in SY 2025-26, the "direct certification list" will be renamed the **Direct Certification S-EBT List**. This change reflects that students eligible for S-EBT will also automatically qualify for free or reduced-price meals or free milk and will be listed on the Direct Certification S-EBT list with special codes. Note that S-EBT eligibility is **not** considered direct certification since the household submitted an application to the S-EBT team for review and approval. Please review this new document carefully and share it with all relevant staff.

- Direct Certification Rollover: The CSDE IT Department is currently working on the SY 2025-26 direct certification rollover. The Bureau of Child Nutrition will notify districts via email once the rollover is completed.
- Addendum C: As a reminder, the <u>Addendum C: Information on the Supplemental Nutrition</u>

 <u>Assistance Program (SNAP) New Increased Income Guidelines Effective October 1, 2024</u>, will not be updated until the end of September.

Updated USDA Professional Standards Training Tracker Tool

Team Nutrition recently announced the latest update to the <u>Professional Standards Training Tracker Tool</u>. The Professional Standards Training Database, previously a site to search for relevant professional standards trainings, has been integrated into the Professional Standards Trainings and Tracker Tool (PSTTT), allowing users to both find training and log it for record keeping.

This integration is the result of user feedback, and it provides a new guest user access option for those who do not want to use the PSTTT for logging annual training hours.

Both registered and guest users will be able to search for and access Professional Standards trainings from the PSTTT site. Users may search for a training and view details such as title, length, format, provider, and cost. Links to trainings will allow users to navigate to the website where the training is hosted. Training format ranges from online trainings, print materials, and even face-to-face trainings.

The <u>USDA Child Nutrition Dashboard</u> is comprised of public data published in the <u>child nutrition</u> <u>tables</u>. The goal of the dashboard is to provide national and state level visualization of meals served, participation, and funding data for the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Child and Adult Care Food Program, and Summer Food Service Program. The dashboard can be used by federal, state, and local organizations to assess trends in child nutrition program activity.
