# Reminder: Triennial Assessment (Due June 30, 2025) and Reporting Form Due September 15, 2025

As a reminder, all sponsors were federally required to complete the triennial assessment of their Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP) by June 30, 2025, and to make the results publicly available. This includes posting the assessment summary on the organization's website or sharing it through other public channels.

In addition, the CSDE requires all sponsors to complete the <u>Triennial Assessment Reporting Form</u> by September 15, 2025. This reporting form allows the CSDE to track sponsor compliance with federal requirements related to the triennial assessment and public disclosure of LSWP implementation.

#### Reminder: Annual Financial Report for School Nutrition Programs Due September 15, 2025

To maintain the school food authority's (SFA) nonprofit status, the NSLP regulations require that the fund balance (net cash resources [NCR]) of the nonprofit school food service account (NSFSA) cannot exceed three months' average expenditures at any time. SFAs must document compliance with the NCR requirement by submitting the annual Financial Report for School Nutrition Programs in the Connecticut Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System) by September 15, 2025. The CSDE's Instructions for Submitting the Financial Report for School Nutrition Programs provides step-by-step guidance on how to complete this report.

The CTG4CTK Grant provides funding to strengthen farm to school programs across Connecticut. Schools, early childhood providers, farmers, and community partners are all eligible to apply. Awards are available through **four tracks**:

- Track 1: Producer Capacity Building Microgrants to help farmers increase their ability to sell to schools and early care providers.
- Track 2: Farm & Family Learning (ECE & Beyond) Support for childcare providers and networks to expand farm-to-ECE programs.
- Track 3: Local Procurement Assistance Support for schools to expand local food purchasing and related activities.
- Track 4: Experiential Learning, AgTech, and Innovation Hands-on learning such as school gardens, farm field trips, and nutrition education.
