Final Reminder: CSDE Virtual Procurement 101 Training (November 12 and 13, 2025): Register by November 9, 2025

The CSDE's virtual two-day Procurement 101 Training provides a comprehensive overview of the procurement requirements for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). Section 7 CFR 210.21(h) of the NSLP regulations requires that all school personnel with procurement responsibilities associated with the Child Nutrition Programs must attend annual procurement training. Attendance at both sessions is required to complete the training. Registration is required.
