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## Action Items

### CT Fresh Ed: Compass Due June 1, 2026

The CT Fresh Ed: Compass is due June 1, 2026. School food authorities (SFAs) can reach out to their [Regional Farm to School Coordinator](#) for support with the CT Fresh Ed: Compass.

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### Requests to Extend the NSLP and/or SBP into the Summer Months (July and August) due June 12, 2026

Local educational agencies (LEAs) may serve reimbursable lunches and/or breakfasts through an extension of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP) during the summer months (beyond June 30, 2026) if one of the following two criteria apply: 1) the school year is extended; or 2) an official required academic summer school program is in place.

LEAs requesting an extension of the NSLP and/or SBP during summer 2026 must consider the following:

- only students enrolled in the extended school year or academic summer school program can receive meals;
- for sites not operating under the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a student's school year 2026-27 free and reduced-price eligibility by direct certification or free or reduced-price meal application will be used for the counting and claiming of meals;
- meals will be claimed as free, reduced price, or paid based on student eligibility;
- meals must be charged at the correct price (reduced price \$.30 breakfast or \$.40 lunch, and district established paid lunch price);
- multiple meal distribution and non-congregate meals are not allowed;
- proper point-of-service meal counts are required (based on student eligibility); and
- sites approved to operate the CEP must utilize their approved claiming percentages to claim meals.

To be eligible to serve and claim reimbursable meals during summer due to an extension of the school year or a required academic summer school, interested LEAs must submit an email requesting an extension of their NSLP and/or SBP to Jen Bove at [jennifer.bove@ct.gov](mailto:jennifer.bove@ct.gov) by **June 12, 2026**. The email must include:

- the schools requesting the extension;
- the reason for the extension, e.g., academic summer school;

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- the meal or meals the site will be serving (breakfast only, lunch only, breakfast and lunch); and
- the start and end date of the program.

**Note:** To submit July and/or August claims for reimbursement for the approved sites and dates, the LEA must first have an **approved** school year (SY) 2026-27 Sponsor Agreement. The CSDE will be providing a future email with instructions on updating the SY 2026-27 Sponsor Agreement. The LEA must submit the online agreement for CSDE approval by **July 30, 2026**, to submit the July claim for reimbursement.

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## Need to Know

### CT Fresh Ed: Buy Local Program School Year 2025-26 Allocations for the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)



In school year 2025-26, SFAs participating in the CT Fresh Ed: Buy Local Program (BLP) received an upward adjustment to their NSLP allocation if they also sponsor Summer Meal Programs and/or CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Meals Programs.

These additional funds were determined using a proportional formula based on each sponsor's share of prior year reimbursement claims across the Community Nutrition Programs, including the SFSP, Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the NSLP, and CACFP. Funding was fully scaled according to overall

reimbursements, with no base allocation provided. Specific allocation amounts are available in the CSDE's document, [CT Fresh Ed: Buy Local Program School Year 2025-26 Allocations for the Summer Food Service Program \(SFSP\) and Child and Adult Care Food Program \(CACFP\)](#).

SFAs may use CT Fresh Ed: Buy Local Program funds to support all eligible Child Nutrition Programs. ### Institute of Child Nutrition Webinar: Growing Connections: Safe Sourcing and Handling of Fresh Produce, May 27, 2026



Building relationships with local farms starts with the buyer. Sourcing locally can be a win-win for your school and community, but finding the right farm partners to safely grow, purchase and deliver fresher ingredients takes some know-how. This webinar walks down the garden path from identifying and vetting potential growers to food safety requirements and recommendations for specifying, receiving, storing, preparing, and serving fresh produce. Chef Andy Montero will also share culinary tricks of the trade with live demonstrations on handling and preparing fresh-from-the-farm ingredients like a pro.

#### Learning Objectives

- Identify best practices for sourcing fresh produce from local farms.
- Review Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) requirements for growers and producers, including on-farm practices that reduce the risk of foodborne illness.
- Explain the difference between food product liability insurance and general farm liability insurance.
- Demonstrate kitchen techniques and handling tips for working with fresh, locally sourced produce.
