USDA Foods Reminder: Notifying Vendors about Menu Changes as Students Return to In-person Learning

As many schools plan to resume in-person learning in the coming weeks, it is important for schools to be proactive and communicate with vendors about anticipated changes to school menus. Please remember to update your vendors about changes to menu items and potential usage of USDA Foods. Net-off-invoice further processed USDA Foods and commercial products have been stocked based on your current usage. If schools will be using different menu items and increasing usage of other items, vendors need sufficient advance notice to adjust par levels in time to meet changing needs.

USDA Foods Update: Shredded White Cheddar Cheese, Material Code 10002

Please review your HPC allocation reports and plan to take all remaining shredded white cheddar cheese. This product is nearing the end of its shelf-life and should be used or frozen by **April 20, 2021**. If frozen, the product should thawed in a cooler. The thawed product should be used within two days of thawing. The last date to order this cheese is **Friday, April 2, 2021**. If you do not plan on using your shredded cheddar cheese, please submit a <u>Request to Donate USDA Foods</u> Form by **Friday, March 26, 2021**.

Pandemic Electronic Benefits (P-EBT) for Children in Schools

The Department of Social Services (DSS), in collaboration with the CSDE, received approval to operate the most current version of P-EBT for children in schools (known as P-EBT 2.0 for school year (SY) 2020-21). P-EBT 2.0 is a federal program that provides a supplemental nutrition benefit for households with children who have temporarily lost access to free or reduced-price school meals due to pandemic-related school closures, reduced attendance, or reduced capacity for five consecutive days or longer.

The basic P-EBT eligibility criteria for children in schools remains unchanged from the previous version. Under the current public health emergency, a school child is eligible for P-EBT benefits in SY 2020-21 if the child meets the two P-EBT conditions for eligibility:

- The child would have received free or reduced-price school meals under the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) if not for the COVID public health emergency.
- 2. The child does not receive free or reduced-price meals at school because the school is closed or has been operating with reduced attendance or hours for at least five consecutive days in the current school year.

Most Connecticut schools are offering meals at no cost to all students for SY 2020-21, due to the public health emergency. However, P-EBT student eligibility for free or reduced-priced school meals is determined using:

- a school meals application approved for free or reduced-priced meals on file with the student's school;
- direct certification for free or reduced-priced school meals through receiving SNAP, TFA, or Husky A (≤ 185% FPL) with DSS;
- direct certification for free school meals through determination as foster, homeless, runaway, and some Head Start; or
- enrollment in a school participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP).

Eligible households will receive up to two benefit deposits. Deposit 1 covers the months of September 2020 through January 2021. Deposit 2 covers the months of February 2021 through the end of the school year. The amount a household receives depends on what the learning mode the student was in each month and could be different from student to student.

Dairy Grant Opportunity for School Meals: Deadline is April 23, 2021

The Connecticut Milk Promotion Board and New England Dairy are pleased to announce a funding opportunity from Connecticut Dairy Farmers to eligible Connecticut schools.
