Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Webpage: Safely Distributing School Meals during COVID-19

The CDC's <u>Safely Distributing School Meals during COVID-19</u> webpage provides guidance and resources for school nutrition programs on school meal distribution models that follow core mitigation strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19. School nutrition program operators can choose to use one model or a combination of models to safely distribute meals that best serve the students and families in their community. Program operators should determine and modify their distribution practices as needed, based on local, state, and federal policies (including the USDA Child Nutrition COVID-19 waivers) and the local level of spread in each community.

USDA Foods Delivery Schedules and Reminder to Submit Request to Donate USDA Foods Form

The USDA Direct Delivery and USDA DoD Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program will continue to make deliveries through June. As a reminder, you may submit a *Request to Donate USDA Foods* form any time in May if you are unable to use all of your remaining inventory of USDA Foods at the HPC warehouse. It is the CT FDP's responsibility to ensure that all USDA Foods are used appropriately, so any RA that has not ordered consistently this year, or submitted a Request to Donate USDA Foods Forms throughout the school year, should expect cases of food to be transferred out of their account. Input Requested for American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) Education Funding

As part of the recently enacted American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP), the CSDE secured education funding for the purposes of "identifying homeless children and youth, providing wraparound services in light of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and providing assistance needed to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities." While Connecticut awaits further instruction and the disbursement of these funds by the U.S. Department of Education, the CSDE is soliciting initial feedback from interested individuals through a short <u>survey</u>. This survey is intended to spur initial conversations that will lead to more in-depth discussion in the near future. Instructions for Submitting the 2021-22 Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement: Due July 1, 2021

As indicated in Operational Memorandum No. 03-21: Requirements for Submitting the Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement for School Year 2020-21, all public school sponsors of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) must complete the annual HFC Statement and upload the board of education's meeting minutes by July 1, 2021, using the CSDE's Online Application and Claiming System for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP System). The HFC application module of the CNP System is now open for NSLP sponsors to complete their 2021-22 HFC Statement and upload their board minutes. Please read the important information below before beginning this process.

- Before accessing the CNP System, please read the instructions, <u>Submitting Connecticut's Healthy Food Certification Statement for School Year 2021-22</u>. This document provides important information and specific steps for completing the 2021-22 HFC Statement in the CNP System.
- There are two steps for completing the 2021-22 HFC Statement.
 - 1. The sponsor's **claims preparer** first **enrolls** the district in the 2021-22 application process for school nutrition programs. Sponsors *cannot* access the online HFC module until this step is complete.
 - 2. After the claims preparer enrolls the sponsor, the sponsor's **authorized signer 1 or 2** must complete, certify, and submit the HFC Statement. The claims preparer **cannot** complete this process. The instructions in the first bullet above provide detailed information on this process.
- The HFC application requirements are summarized in the "<u>Apply</u>" section of the HFC webpage and <u>CSDE Operational Memorandum No. 03-21</u>: *Process for Submitting the Healthy Food Certification (HFC) Statement for School Year 2020-21*. For additional guidance, review the CSDE's presentation, <u>Application Procedures for HFC</u>.
- Complete the HFC module only: Do not begin the application process to participate in the USDA school nutrition programs for school year 2021-22. The CSDE will notify sponsors when it is time to start the online application process for school nutrition programs.

During the current COVID-19 public health emergency, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has established nationwide waivers to support access to nutritious meals, while enforcing recommendations from public health experts with regard to social distancing measures. In addition, the USDA allows states to request waivers enabling sponsors to serve meals in more flexible ways during closures related to COVID-19.
