# USDA Memo SP 16-2021 and CACFP 14-2021: Previously Issued Questions and Answers Relating to Operation of the Child Nutrition Programs: Updated for School Year 2021-2022

This <u>USDA memo from July 14, 2021</u>, includes consolidated questions and answers intended to provide clarification to state agencies and program operators as they operate the child nutrition programs, including the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), NSLP Seamless Summer Option (SSO), and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), during school year 2021-22. These questions and answers were previously issued in calendar year 2020 and have been updated for application to school year 2021-22. The memo is available on the CSDE's Operational Memoranda for School Nutrition Programs webpage.

#### P-EBT Guidance for New Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Districts

Over the past few weeks, the USDA Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has received questions on the application process for P-EBT summer benefits in schools that have been newly approved to operate the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) in school year 2021-22. Specifically, states have asked whether those schools (or their school districts) may collect applications to establish the summer 2021 P-EBT eligibility for children in those schools after July 1. Unfortunately, the answer is no. The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) regulations do not offer any flexibility. Please see below for additional information.

Collecting NSLP applications to establish P-EBT eligibility in the summer of 2021 by schools newly approved to participate in the CEP on July 1:

- School food authorities (SFAs) with schools or school groups that have been newly approved to
  participate in the CEP cannot collect applications from households with children in those
  schools or school groups under the NSLP regulations as of July 1. That means that as of today,
  these SFAs are not permitted to collect school meal applications from households of children
  who wish to establish their income eligibility for P-EBT for summer 2021.
- 2. The affected population is limited to households with children in newly approved CEP schools who are not already certified eligible for free or reduced price school meals, and have not already submitted applications to establish their eligibility for P-EBT this summer. Since there are just a few weeks remaining in most states' summer P-EBT application periods, FNS expects that the number of affected households is small. Nevertheless, FNS understands that you need guidance on how to proceed, and suggests the following:
  - a. Applications already received from affected households, but not yet processed, can and should be processed by SFAs. Children determined eligible for free or reduced price meals through these applications are eligible for the state's full P-EBT summer benefit.

- b. Applications received from these households after July 1 must be treated as non-NSLP applications. This means that the cost of staff time used to process these applications cannot be charged to the SFA nonprofit food service account. However, the cost of that staff time may be claimed as a P-EBT administrative expense under the process established by the USDA for federal reimbursement of state and local P-EBT administrative costs.
- c. If feasible, these schools should make alternative household income forms available to affected households for the remainder of the state's P-EBT summer application period.

# Public School Information System (PSIS) Monthly Attendance Data for 2020-21 Now Closed

The CSDE has concluded the PSIS monthly membership and attendance data collection for the 2020-21 school year. The data have been transferred to the Department of Social Services (DSS) for issuance of Pandemic EBT benefits for the 2020-21 school year. No further revisions can be made to the PSIS monthly membership and attendance data for the 2020-21 school year.
