The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) final rule, *Professional Standards for State and Local School Nutrition Programs Personnel as Required by the HHFKA of 2010*, requires minimum education standards and annual training standards for school nutrition professionals who manage and operate the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). These standards ensure that school nutrition personnel have the knowledge, training, and tools needed to plan, prepare, and purchase healthy products to create nutritious, safe, and enjoyable school meals. This document summarizes the training hours and professional standards topics provided by the CSDE's training program, *Determining Eligibility in the School Nutrition Programs and Summer Food Service Program*.

Training Description

The CSDE's Determining Eligibility in the School Nutrition Programs and Summer Food Service Program training program is a series of recorded modules that provide comprehensive guidance on guidance on complying with the USDA regulations for determining a child's eligibility for free or reduced-price meals or free milk in the school nutrition programs and free meals in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). This training program is intended for the staff responsible for approving applications for free and reduced-price meals or free milk, conducting direct certification, and ensuring the accuracy of eligibility determinations through the verification process.

USDA Key Areas and Training Topics

The CSDE's *Determining Eligibility* training program meets the USDA's Professional Standards training topics for the key area of 3000 "Free and Reduced-price Meal Benefits." This key area includes the training topics below.

- 3110 Eligibility
- 3120 Direct Certification

Training Hours

Table 1 summarizes the training hours in each module. Completing all seven modules of the CSDE's *Determining Eligibility* training program provides **4.75 training hours** toward the annual training requirements of the USDA's Professional Standards. Completing less than seven modules provides the specific training hours indicated for each module (refer to table 1). For example, a person who only completes modules 1 and 2 earns 1.5 training hours.

2: Processing Applications (length: 1:22:12)	1.25	Reviews the requirements for processing free and reduced-price meal or milk a applications including flagging applications, error-prone applications, notifying households of eligibility, application addenda, processing timeframes, carryover and transfer of eligibility, requirements for a complete application, calculating income on an application, applications for foster children, handling written SNAP or TFA case numbers, web-based applications, verification for cause, benefit issuance document, independent review of applications, records retention, and appeal procedures.
3: Direct Certification (length: 44:37)	0.5	Reviews the requirements for the direct certification process, including the types of direct certification, hierarchy of eligibility, CSDE's Direct Certification Web Application, direct certification of foster children, and records retention for direct certification. Also includes "DC or Not DC," a quiz to test participants' knowledge about direct certification.
4: Test Your Knowledge About Processing Applications (length: 30:55 plus 30 minutes for worksheet activity)	1.0	Provides an activity to test participants' knowledge about processing applications by reviewing seven examples of a completed Application for Free and Reduced-price School Meals or Free Milk. This module is based on the information provided in modules 1-3.
5: Confidentiality and Disclosure (length: 21:20)	0.25	Reviews the confidentiality requirements for directly certifying students and processing applications, including preventing overt identification of students' eligibility status and restrictions for disclosing student's personal information.
