




Terms to Know

Potable Water

Drinking water that comes from surface and ground sources and is treated to levels that meet state and federal standards for consumption



Water Requirement Applies To

- National School Lunch Program (NSLP)
- School Breakfast Program (SBP)
- Afterschool Snack Program (ASP)
- Seamless Summer Option (SSO) school sites only



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When Water Requirement Applies

 Program
 Requirement

 NSLP *
 Any location where lunch is served

 SBP *
 Cafeteria only

 ASP
 During snack service

 * Includes SSO school sites

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


Field Trips

- Water requirement does not apply
- USDA encourages water availability



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Examples of Offering Water in NSLP and SBP • Offer water pitchers and cups on tables or in accessible area

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Examples of Offering Water in NSLP and SBP

- Provide unrestricted access to water fountain or faucet
 - 1. Location must be in foodservice area or immediately adjacent
 - 2. Must be operational

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3. Supervisory staff must allow students access



Examples of Offering Water in NSLP and SBP Offer bottled water

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



Important Considerations

- Water is not part of reimbursable meals or ASP snacks
- Students are not required to take water
- Cannot promote or offer water as alternative selection to fluid milk throughout food service area



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Allowable Costs for Offering Water

- No separate funding or reimbursement
- May use funds from nonprofit school food service account (NSFSA) for allowable costs



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
Costs Related to Providing Water Must Always Be

- Reasonable
- Necessary
- Allocable to school nutrition programs



Depends on specific circumstances of individual school food authority
