National Resource Center for Paraeducators (NRCP) Conference Schedule Available. Early Bird Deadline Extended to January 10th!

Breakout sessions designed to provide paraeducators with practical strategies for implementation in the classroom, including common core, early childhood, supervision, proactive behavior management, autism, strategies for students with significant cognitive disabilities, techniques for communication, and building effective teacher/paraeducator teams will be offered. The schedule also includes sessions on model programs and systems for pareducators and techniques for communications and building effective teacher/paraeducator teams designed especially for teachers, school administrators, directors of special education and other central office administrators, state staff, state or regional trainers and staff, and higher education personnel.

2016 Anne Marie Murphy Paraeducator of the Year Program

The CSDE and the School Paraprofessional Advisory Council has established the Anne Marie Murphy Paraeducator of the Year Program to recognize the important role of the paraeducator in supporting student achievement. This award is named in honor of Anne Marie Murphy, a paraeducator who was killed in the Sandy Hook shooting. The program honors one paraeducator who has demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication in the performance of his/her job, thereby earning that person the respect and admiration of other paraeducators, students, teachers, administrators, co-workers, and parents. Application packets will be sent to all Superintendents and school directors, the beginning of January. The next paraeducator of the year will be identified in the fall of 2015 and serve from January 2016-December 2016.
