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## Methodology

Initial eligibility in this program was limited to the high schools across the 33 Alliance Districts. Once the needs were met for those Alliance high schools, eligibility expanded to include high schools beyond Alliance District where more than 40 percent of students qualify for free or reduced-price meals. The remaining 708 laptops are being proportionally distributed among all non-Alliance districts (except state-run districts) with at least 40 percent free-or-reduced price meal (FRPM) eligible students in Grades $9-12$, based on the number of FRPM students in those districts. This approach maximizes the number of non-Alliance districts that will receive at least some laptops through this initiative. Districts are encouraged to target distribution of these laptops to students most in need.
