- 2. Login using your username and password.
 - a. Username_____b. Password ______
- 3. Go to the toolbar at the top of the page and click on the tab that reads: "PSAT/NMSQT".
- 4. Below the title bar there are three icons. Click on the middle icon labeled "Get PSAT/NMQST Scores Now".
- 5. Below your total score there is a blue icon labeled "view details", click it!
- 6. Scroll down to the "Test Scores" section. Here you will see your three scores in Reading, Writing, and Math.
- 7. In the reading score box, click on the blue outlined icon labeled "Reading Questions".
- 8. Underneath the "Test Key" there is a filter drop down menu. Under the drop down menu labeled "Response", click the down arrow and change the filter to incorrect answers.

PSAT Conference/Reflection

Now that you've tallied up your incorrect answers, we'd like you to **analyze** your scores further.

Examine the following:

- What question type was your **strength** (fewest incorrect)?
- What area(s) were **weak** or will require more work (most incorrect)? Explain why, if possible.

Next, examine the **difficulty level** of the questions:

- Consider why you might have struggled with particular questions.
- Provide explanations whenever possible.

Finally, conclude with a **general statement** about your performance and **your plans** for the test in March.

Sample Reflection:

Overall, I did best on the vocabulary or "Words in Context" sections. I only got one "Words in Context" question wrong; it was also an "Analysis in Science" question and I didn't understand a few of the other words in the paragraph.

Unsurprisingly, "Analysis in Science" was my weakest area. In school, science is the subject I find most challenging, so I know I need to seek extra help.

In general, I got a lot of easy and medium difficulty questions right. I'm proud of that. The vast majority of the questions I got wrong were the most difficult ones. Should I skip those or guess? Or do I need to practice harder questions? I'll talk to my teacher or guidance counselor about that.

Overall, I'm happy with how well I did on this test, but excited to see if I can do better. I plan on using Khan Academy and getting extra help from my teachers. I'm aiming for at least a 100 point increase by the time I take it again.
