Next Generation Accountability Reporting Underway

The CSDE will release 2024-25 state summative assessment results publicly by the end of August. Districts will have an opportunity to preview final results prior to the public release. The release will include subject performance indices for English language arts (ELA), mathematics, and science (Indicator 1) as well as Smarter Balanced growth (Indicators 2a-d).

The final annual attendance results submitted through the June Public School Information System (PSIS) Collection and certified by districts is now available in both EdSight Public and EdSight Secure. The chronic absenteeism data for the All Students and High Needs student groups is Indicator 4 in the Next Generation Accountability System.

Assessment and attendance data are an important part of the Next Generation Accountability results, but there are other indicators currently under review. On August 15, authorized users of EdSight Secure gained access to a preview of three Next Generation accountability indicators based on Teacher-Course-Student (TCS) data. These are: Indicator 5 – College and Career Readiness Course Taking; Indicator 7 – On Track to High School Graduation; and Indicator 12 – Arts Access.

The TCS Accountability Indicators Preview Reports in EdSight Secure provide aggregate results and a list of students included in the numerator and denominator of each indicator. Changes greater than ±10% from the prior year are highlighted in the report. Districts can use this report to validate their TCS submissions and make changes if necessary. The deadline for all changes is 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 3. The following timeline is provided to support districts in ensuring TCS data are complete and accurate.

- Friday, August 15: Report available in EdSight Secure with TCS data as of August 11.
- Thursday, August 21: Report refreshed in EdSight Secure with TCS data as of August 20.
- Thursday, August 28: Report refreshed in EdSight Secure with TCS data as of August 27.
- Wednesday, September 3 at 3 pm: FINAL deadline for TCS submission.


 Monday, September 8: Report refreshed with FINAL TCS data as of September 3.

The table below lists the various components of the Next Generation Accountability system with planned release dates. Indicators that have already been publicly reported have release dates marked with an asterisk. Final accountability reports are scheduled to be released in early November. In the meantime, the online Accountability Estimator Tool can be used to estimate a school or district's overall Accountability Index before final accountability reports are issued. The Performance Office hosted a Behind the Numbers session in September 2023 to demonstrate how to use the online tool. The recording is available on the CSDE YouTube Channel.

NAEP 2026 Update

Districts and schools selected to participate in the 2026 administration of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) have been notified.

The NAEP 2026 cycle will include the three assessment programs listed below. NAEP will be administered to Connecticut students in a sample of approximately 180 schools from January 26 to March 20, 2026. Students will respond to questions in mathematics, reading, civics, or U.S. history, and each student will answer questions in only one subject.

- State-level assessments: Grades 4 and 8 mathematics and reading
- National-level assessments: Grade 8 civics and U.S. history
- Pilot testing: Grades 4, 8, and 12 mathematics and reading
