
## **Dual Credit Expansion Grant Program Now Accepting Applications**

On Monday, May 1, the CSDE announced the Dual Credit Expansion Grant Program. The program is designed to provide funding for public school districts for startup costs associated with increasing the number and types of dual credit courses offered in partnership with Connecticut's institutions of higher education (IHE). These college-level courses can be part of traditional academic pathways or careeroriented pathways leading to industryrecognized credentials. Dual credit courses recording is available on the CSDE's include dual enrollment (taken on a college campus) and concurrent

enrollment courses (taken on the high school campus). The goal of these expansion efforts is to increase the number of students earning non-remedial college credit while enrolled in high school and the number of college credits students earn prior to high school graduation. District grant applications must be received by 5 pm on July 17, 2023. The CSDE hosted a virtual information session for districts on Monday May 8, 2023. The YouTube Channel. #### **Physical Fitness Assessment Data Collection Webinar**

As previously mentioned, the CSDE is collecting individual student assessment achievement levels for the Connecticut Physical Fitness Assessment (CPFA) in 2022-23. Districts are required to provide the achievement level attained for all four CPFA components for all students in tested grades through the CPFA Individual Student Collection by July 6, 2023.

To further support this collection effort, the Performance Office is hosting a webinar on May 19 at 2:30 p.m. to briefly review the collection application. #### **Nine CCERC Projects Underway**

The Center for Connecticut Education Research Collaboration (CCERC) is a research partnership between the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) and institutions of higher education across Connecticut. The mission of CCERC is to address pressing issues in the state's public schools through high quality evaluation and research that leverages the expertise of researchers from different institutions possessing varied methodological expertise and content knowledge. District and school leaders across our state are critical partners in this work. Many of the projects require an in-depth review of local policies and practices, especially when there have been large investments in the

area of study. These important evaluation studies require district cooperation with researchers.

In addition to the evaluation studies released on <u>LEAP</u>, <u>summer enrichment</u>, and <u>remote learning</u>, nine additional projects are underway and listed on the <u>CCERC website</u>:

# **Districts Identify Postsecondary Readiness Leads**

The CSDE is working on several fronts to expand dual

credit opportunities for high school students. As part of this effort, districts were asked in March to report at least one Postsecondary Readiness Lead through the Contacts Manager Application. Postsecondary Readiness Leads are individuals at the district and school-level who are responsible for developing and nurturing partnerships with postsecondary institutions and
